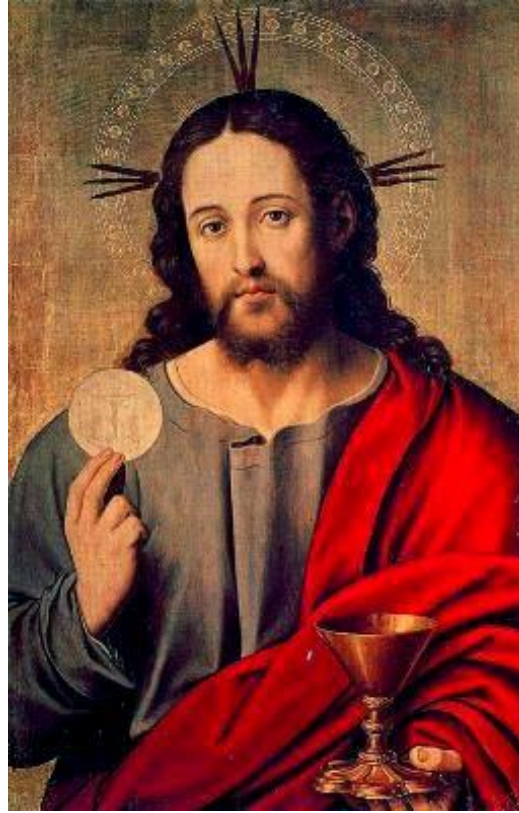

Pastor's Letter:

Corpus Christi



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Second Vatican Council said that the Holy Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith. That sounds nice, but what does that really mean? What does that look like on a daily basis? Well, I think it's really quite simple. What it means is that when we come to Holy Mass on Sunday (or any day for that matter) and give our full attention to the worship of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit; then we should rightly have a "mountain top" experience. There is nothing greater than the praise and worship of God. For at Mass especially, we literally meet Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. At Mass, we offer our lives to God and in return, we are given the body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus; to strengthen us and nourish us. That is the very definition of love! When we take this seriously, we should then naturally recognize that the Lord Jesus is everything to us and is the source of all we are and all we do. A relationship is then established with Him and we truly become His disciples.

My friends, deepen your knowledge and love of the Holy Eucharist. Jesus comes to us in this real and tangible way so that we can know and love Him in a real and intimate way. It's all been done for us and for our salvation. Spend time in prayer (silent prayer is best!) before the Blessed Sacrament and allow the Lord to speak to you and guide you. He desires to be one with you, so cling to Him and Him alone. The Eucharist is His gift to us. May we receive Him worthily and with reverence, so that we can abide with Him on the mountain top of our lives!
