Pastor's Letter:



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

People have asked me how best to pray for persecuted Christians in Iraq and the middle east, who are being put to the test by Islamic radicals; those who are killing (by beheading and even crucifixion) men, women and children. I think the most effective prayer is to invoke God's Divine Mercy. Jesus is the only answer to any problem that we face. When faced with pure evil, only the Lord Jesus and His infinite mercy can protect those in harm's way and stop the senseless slaughter. We need to place our trust solely in the Lord Jesus.

I recommend praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3:00 p.m. (the hour of mercy) and offer it for the intention of our brothers and sisters in Christ whose faith is being put to the test. We pray that Jesus may uplift them and sustain them in this time of trial. We pray that ISIS radicals will be stopped from further murderous acts.

Praying the chaplet is easy. You can use a rosary. Start with the sign of the cross, then: Pray the Our Father; pray the Hail Mary; and then pray the Apostles' Creed.

On the Our Father beads pray: *"Eternal Father, I offer you the body and blood, soul and divinity of your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world."*

On the Hail Mary beads pray: *"For the sake of His sorrowful passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world."*

At the conclusion pray three times: *"Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world."*

Women's Housing Equality and Enhancement League, advocating for increased shelter and housing among women.

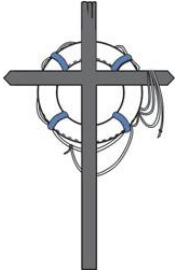

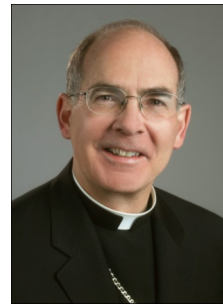
