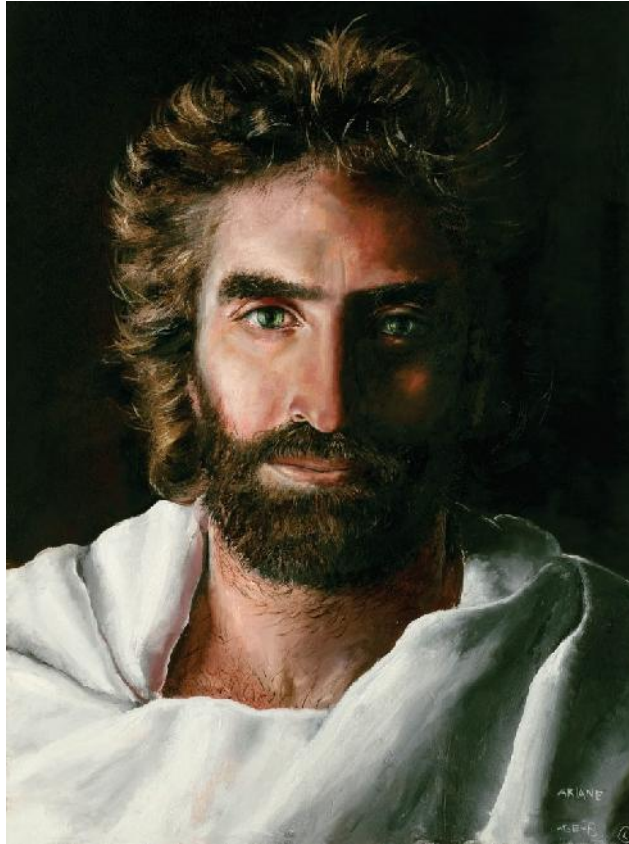

Pastor's Letter:



"It is I who arm you, though you know me not, so that toward the rising and the setting of the sun people may know that there is none beside me. I am the Lord, there is no other." Isaiah 45:6

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Lord speaks powerfully through the Prophet Isaiah in our first reading. It's truly a prophecy of the coming of the Lord Jesus into the world. For us today, this is a powerful reminder of who the Jesus IS for us. Notice I say "IS" and not "was." Too many people, Catholics included, believe, think, and feel that Jesus is a man of the past; that he lived 2,000 years ago, was a moral teacher, a prophet, a good and kind guy. Then he died. If that were true, then who cares? But it's not true. Jesus died....and rose from the dead. What's more, He is a real person who is alive today and is active in our world, in our Church, and in our individual lives, whether we know it or not! He is a living reality who we can know and love, just as Isaiah said.

My friends, the Lord Jesus is a living reality. He is a person we can really know. He is not a concept or a doctrine. He is our creator; He knows us to the depths of our being and loves us in that place more than we can imagine. He wants us to know Him in the same way. He wants to heal us, make us whole, and experience life to the fullest. And He wants us to join Him as His saints in heaven at the end of our lives. Today, He waits for us to approach Him. Blessed Teresa of Calcutta said: "All we have is today....so, let us begin." Let us begin, right now!
