MUSIC DURING THE TRIDUUM

One of my colleagues has compared the musical intensity of Catholics' holiest three days with the Superbowl. So much music is required that it's difficult to find time to rehearse it all. Fortunately, Mother Church and the Sacramentary give us detailed music instructions so we don't have to re-invent it each year.

The Triduum began quietly with the reception of the Holy Oils which were blessed by the Archbishop at the Chrism Mass. The choir chanted the simplest of acclamations, 'Blessed be God.' The Introit chant advised us to 'Glory in the cross.' The rubrics instructed that the 'Gloria in excelsis' was to be sung as the bells were rung. We sang the Latin Gloria from the 'Missa de Angelus' which many of us have memorized.

Holy Thursday also included the instruction to sing the hymn 'Ubi Caritas' during the 'mandatum' or washing of feet. We sang a setting by Maurice Durufle [there are multiple versions you can listen to on [YouTube](#)]. After the Eucharist, during which the Schola sang Kevin Allen's setting of 'Tantum Ergo' [also on [YouTube](#)] and the Holy Week Choir sang Thomas Tallis's 'My Lord, My Love,' the Sacramentary instructed us to chant the hymn, 'Pange Lingua' as the Eucharist is carried to Sullivan Hall, the temporary altar of repose. We returned to the nave to solemnly chant Psalm 22 as the altar was stripped.

The musical rubrics for Good Friday were equally detailed with the instruction for silence during the entrance and prostration. Highlights of Good Friday's music included:

The Passion According to St. John- William Byrd
The Reproaches- John Sanders
Ehre Sei Gott-Heinrich Schutz

The Easter Vigil began with the lighting of the fire and lighting the new Paschal Candle while the men chanted the ancient Exultet. After the seven chanted vigil songs, the choir, brass, organ, clergy and assembly all joyfully sang the Siena Chant Mass Gloria.

DIVINE MERCY NOVENA

The Divine Mercy novena began as a private devotion which Our Lord revealed to Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska. The words of the prayers were dictated by Christ Himself to Saint Faustina, and Saint Faustina recorded in her diary Our Lord's instructions for each day's prayer.

Christ asked Saint Faustina to recite the novena starting on Good Friday and **ending on Divine Mercy Sunday**, the Octave of Easter (the Sunday after Easter Sunday). The novena can be recited at any time of the year, however, and it is often accompanied by the Divine Mercy Chaplet, which Our Lord also revealed to Saint Faustina. Copies of the Novena will be available in the vestibule on Good Friday.

The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us — all of us. And, he wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others.
