Jubilee of Mercy



Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Saint Augustine said: “Recognize in this bread what hung upon the cross and in this chalice what flowed from His side.”

The Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus, received in Holy Communion, revered in the tabernacle, and adored during prayer, is a central mystery of our faith. It is a mystery because the depths of its meaning cannot fully be taken in and appreciated on “this side of the veil” in a way that is adequate. And that’s ok. As with the Trinity, it’s not important that we fully understand the doctrine or the meaning, but that we encounter the living God as we contemplate the Trinity or receive and adore Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

In the Eucharist, the very Body and Blood of our Lord, we should endeavor to simply rest our minds and hearts in the presence of the Lord and allow Him to teach us, form us, and encounter us as He desires. In other words, stop trying to figure Him out and simply rest in His presence and allow yourself to receive Him on His terms. Jesus will, I know, bless you in this way!
