Pastor's Letter:

Jubilee of Mercy



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

“Jesus, Master, have pity on us!” So said the 10 lepers who met Jesus as he traveled through Samaria on his way to Jerusalem. We are told that he saw them and said: “Go, show yourselves to the priests.” That is what the law said must be done to give proof that a leper, an unclean person under the law, was now healed and thus, made clean. As they went away, all 10 were all healed. But only one was saved....the one who came back and fell at the feet of Jesus in gratitude. Saved in what sense, you might ask? Saved in terms of coming to faith in the one who healed him; Jesus the Christ.

When we seek out God's help in our lives and take it to heart, we open ourselves to Jesus' healing. When we give thanks to God for this grace, we are saved. That increase in faith is what saves us; his healing takes root in our lives to renew and restore us. The same dynamic present that day when Jesus healed the 10 lepers is at work in our day and time as well. Today, people still experience dramatic physical and spiritual healing. When they do, thanks and glory is given to God; faith is increased; salvation achieved; and the good news is spread to others! That is how God continues to touch our lives today. When we approach Jesus and seek his presence in our lives; when we repent and ask for his mercy, he does not hesitate. He simply says, “Go! your faith as saved you.” Thanks be to God!
