## Pastor's Letter:

## Jubilee of Mercy



*The Basilica of Saint John Lateran – Rome and the Pope's Chair*

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This coming Wednesday we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. In this feast, we celebrate much more than the anniversary of a church building's dedication. This Roman basilica is much more than a building! The Lateran Basilica is in reality the mother church of the Church. From the outside it doesn't look like much. But on the inside, you are taken aback by the giant space of the nave....then your eye catches something off at the rear of the sanctuary: a lone marble chair. This is the chair of the Bishop of Rome; the Pope's chair. The Lateran Basilica is the mother church of the Catholic Church...not St. Peter's at the Vatican. It is the Lateran Basilica, and the Bishop's chair in that church, from which Pope Francis shepherds the Roman Catholic Church. Because of this, the focus of our Feast this coming Wednesday is not on the building itself but on what the building signifies: the unity of the whole Church gathered around her bishop, the pope. The Holy Father, Pope Francis, is an amazing pope. Yes, he is controversial on many topics and he is not always that well-spoken, especially on hot button issues. But he is the pope; the Holy Spirit's choice to lead the Church at this time. He is the visible sign of unity in a world and Church that is too often in disunity. This coming Wednesday, we celebrate the unity that is the Bishop of Rome. Pray for him and the Church during these challenging times!
