Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On December 26th, I read this on Twitter :



“There are 364 days till Christmas and people already have their Christmas lights up. Unbelievable.”

Although a facetious “tweet” it does in a way express the sentiment many have, that much in the same way they begin the Christmas mindset so early, losing the joyful anticipation of the season of Advent, they abruptly end the beautiful season of Christmas. Today’s celebration of the Solemnity of the Baptism of Our Lord actually brings to an end the season of Christmas. With all the discarded trees and decorations taken down, it may seem that Christmas has been over for weeks. Valentine’s and even Easter candy are already on sale.



Today, The Church recalls Our Lord's second manifestation or *epiphany* which occurred on the occasion of His baptism in the Jordan. Jesus descended into the River to sanctify its waters and to give them the power to make us children of God. The event takes on the importance of a second creation in which the entire Trinity intervenes and is revealed: **The Father's** voice is heard from the heavens declaring, “You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.” **The Son** is baptized. And, **The Holy Spirit** descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. If you’re on Twitter, you’ll recognize the little bird that invites you “to follow” us, and as the Holy Spirit descended upon our Lord as a dove, we want to always be inspired to *Follow* Jesus. TIDBITS FOR THE “YEAR OF FAITH”...

FAQ #13: (PART II)

Following the advent and manifestation of Pope Paul VI’s encyclical, *Humanae Vitae*, mutinous behavior among the Catholic clergy and theologians displayed itself in massive array. They went so far as to claim that all should “ignore this document”, as publicly noted by one Jesuit priest at the time. Although they used statements from the Vatican II documents to help support their positions, what these dissenters failed to become obedient to was Vatican II itself, and what it taught about the ecclesiology of the Church. They failed to heed by such statements as found in the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, *Lumen Gentium*, which stated, “The college or body of bishops has for all that no authority unless united with the Roman Pontiff, Peter’s successor, as its head, whose primatial authority, let it be added, over all, whether pastors or faithful, remains in its integrity. For the Roman Pontiff. . .has full, supreme, and universal power over the whole Church, a power which he can always exercise unhindered.” (para. 22) Yet, even four years after *Lumen Gentium* had been promulgated, a group of over two-hundred dissenting Catholic theologians published an article in the *New York Times* which made such a bold, concluding statement against *Humanae Vitae*: “Therefore, as Roman Catholic theologians, conscious of our duty and our limitations, we conclude that spouses may responsibly decide according to their conscience that artificial contraception in some circumstances is permissible and indeed necessary to preserve and foster the values and sacredness of marriage.” Their conclusion was not only disastrously erroneous, but was truly an attack on the authority of the Pope himself. So, the question which remained was this: Does the authority of the Pope and the Magisterium flow from the popular vote of the people, or does it originate in God? One fact remains: still, today, far too many Catholics incorrectly answer this question. (To be continued...)
