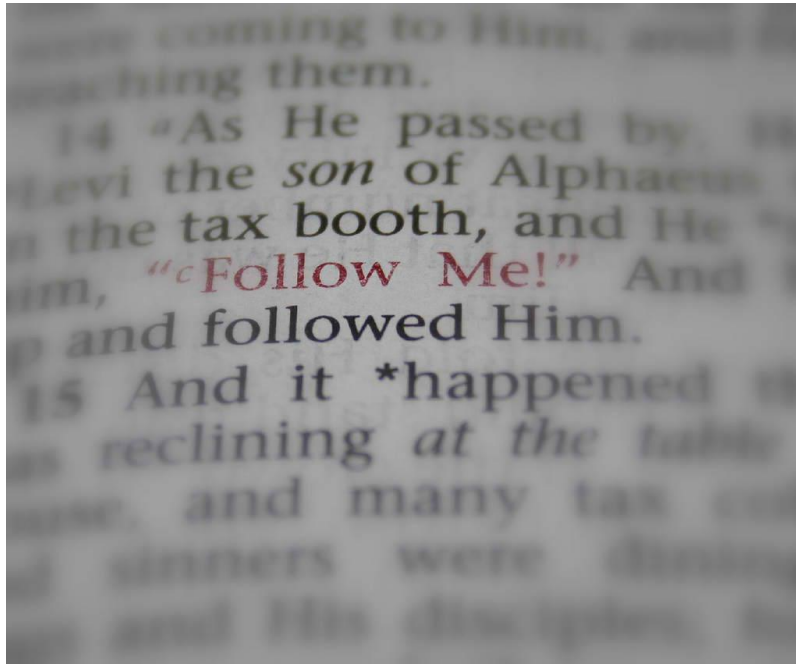

PASTOR'S LETTER:



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In last week's gospel, Saint Peter was in part rebuked by Jesus for his "little faith" as he began to sink into the sea. This week, we hear Jesus utter the opposite when speaking to the Canaanite woman: "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish." What's the difference between the two?

Our faith, whether it is little or great, is the fruit of our action of the will; to believe that Jesus is who He says He is with conviction. That conviction is an act of the will, to put in with Him or not. And that act of the will flows from our decision to follow Him and trust Him in all things. When that act of the will takes place, the faith that is confirmed in us brings with it the power and grace of God. It gave Saint Peter, after he was sinking, the ability to reach out and allow himself to be "caught" by the Lord. It gave the Canaanite woman what she desired: the healing of her daughter. It gives you the ability to: _____.

I would encourage you to fill in the blank this coming week. What does following the Lord Jesus mean for you? How is your decision, as an act of your will, to "put in" with Him, change your life or the life of those you love and pray for? Reflect upon these important questions. I would encourage you to begin to see your life of faith in this more active sense. After all, our following of the Lord and our faith in Him can accomplish many things; it can literally move mountains!
