PASTOR'S LETTER:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This weekend I am away at Ocean Shores as one of the presenters and helpers at the annual Archdiocesan Deacon Convocation. When I was Vicar for Clergy, my office put on the entire event. When I left that assignment, I never thought I would be attending again....but then again, you should never say never! I was asked to attend this year because the topic of the sessions for our permanent deacons and their wives is the Joy of the Gospel; the very topic of the Convocation of Catholic Leaders that I attended last July in Orlando. I guess I'm considered an expert of sorts. But I am happy to attend and spend time with our deacons, who serve so well in parishes across the Archdiocese.

While I am away, I thought I would list the three important quotes from the Rule of Saint Benedict that have been included in my homilies these past months (hence the photo of Mount Angel Abbey). The rule is full of sound wisdom for leading a beautiful and meaningful Christian life. These three points are worth pondering in prayer from time to time:

- *Listen*, my son, to your master's precepts, and incline the ear of your heart. (from the Prologue)
- To *desire* eternal life with all the passion of the spirit. To keep death daily before one's eyes (Rule 4)
- Prefer nothing whatsoever to Christ. And may He bring us all together to life everlasting (Rule 72)

May the Lord keep you all in His loving care in the week ahead!
