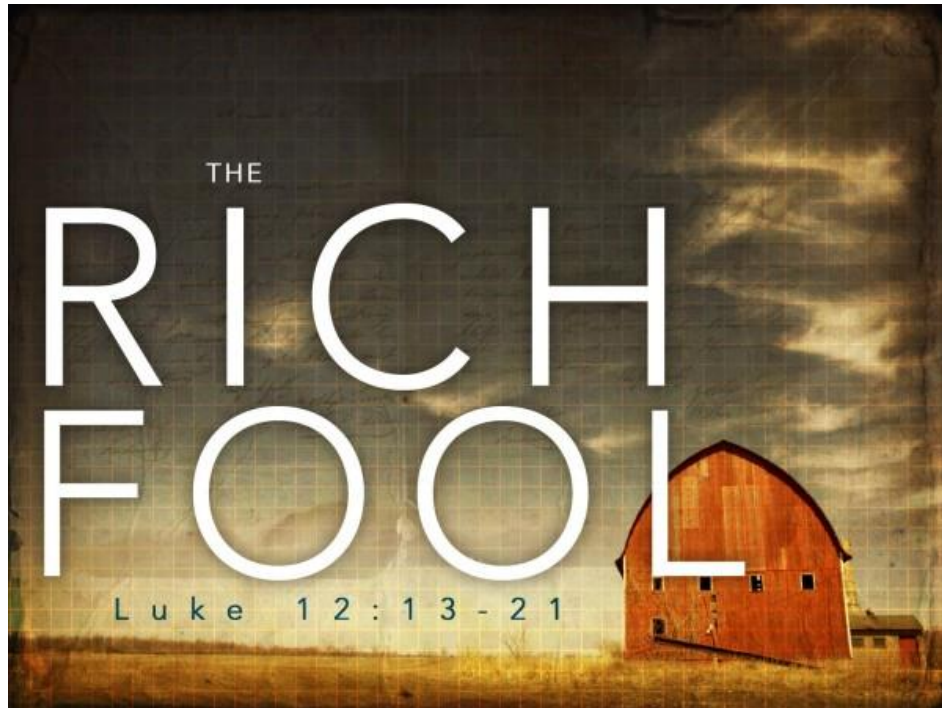

# 18<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday's gospel at Mass contains what is known as the parable of the rich fool (Luke 12:16-21). A rich man produces a bountiful harvest and so he decides to build larger barns to store his new wealth. He becomes the rich fool because he will never enjoy the bounty he stores up, as his life ends suddenly. "Thus will it be for the one who stores up treasure for himself but is not rich in what matters to God." (Luke 12:21).

So, what matters to God? We learn in the next verse, which is not included in the Mass reading, that dependence on God is what matters to God. "He said to his disciples, 'Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life and what you will eat, or about your body and what you will wear . . . instead, seek his kingdom and these other things will be given you besides.'" (Luke 12:22;31).

As Christians, we are called to be rich not in the things of the world but in the things of God. The Lord Jesus instructs us that we must depend not on our own abilities, on our money and wealth; on our intellect, or even what appears to be our good luck. If we do, we become rich fools. Our focus becomes very narrow, and generally upon ourselves. Rather, we are called to depend solely upon God our Father for everything and to never worry about anything. We are called to rest in the Lord, confident that God will provide for our needs, and everything else besides! In doing that we are not rich fools, but fools for Christ! In this way our focus becomes broad, and is generally focused outwardly toward God and neighbor. In this way, our treasure is not stored up for us, but lies instead in our relationship with God and each other; in the things that really matter. I encourage you to pray over this parable and see if your priorities are in line with those of our Heavenly Father.

The procedure is simple: Prior to the beginning of Mass, ask a sacristan that a low gluten host be consecrated for you at Mass. At the time of communion, proceed to the credence table, under the shrine of the Blessed Mother. The sacristan will administer Holy Communion to you at the time. ## END OF YEAR REPORT FROM HOLY NAME OF JESUS HOMEWORK CENTER

The Holy Name of Jesus Homework Center in Bamboo St. Ann, had a very successful year September 2012 to June 2013. The Center catered to persons between the ages of 6 years to 35 years. Activities included: assisting young children with Spelling, Reading and Mathematics to improve their school performance. The results were excellent since some of them were promoted in their classes, some started reading the Scriptures at Church at Youth Sunday Masses and others have started reading on their own. A few still needed individual attention, especially with reading. Some used the Laptops to do their homework.

The High School children continued to use the computers to research topics for their School Based Assessment. Topics researched included; Home Economics, Food and Nutrition, Textile and Clothing, Social Studies; social issues such as, Why are young people staying away from church? Why are children more violent now-a-days? History, Science, etc. The internet afforded them the opportunity to get the appropriate information right there in the homework center, near to their homes.

Some Community Persons also used the homework center. Some have their own Laptops while others used those at the center. Some have used the facility to apply for jobs, to complete assignments and projects. Children who sat their examinations have been very successful and have been promoted to reputable High Schools. Those children already in those schools worked consistently well and got high grades. The use of the homework center enabled them to achieve and they are very appreciative.

Social Activities included; Christmas Party in December and Easter Party in March. At the Christmas Party, there was dancing, exchange of gifts, eating fried chicken and festival, sorrel, ice-cream and cakes. At the Easter Party there was spice bun and cheese, ice-cream and drink.
