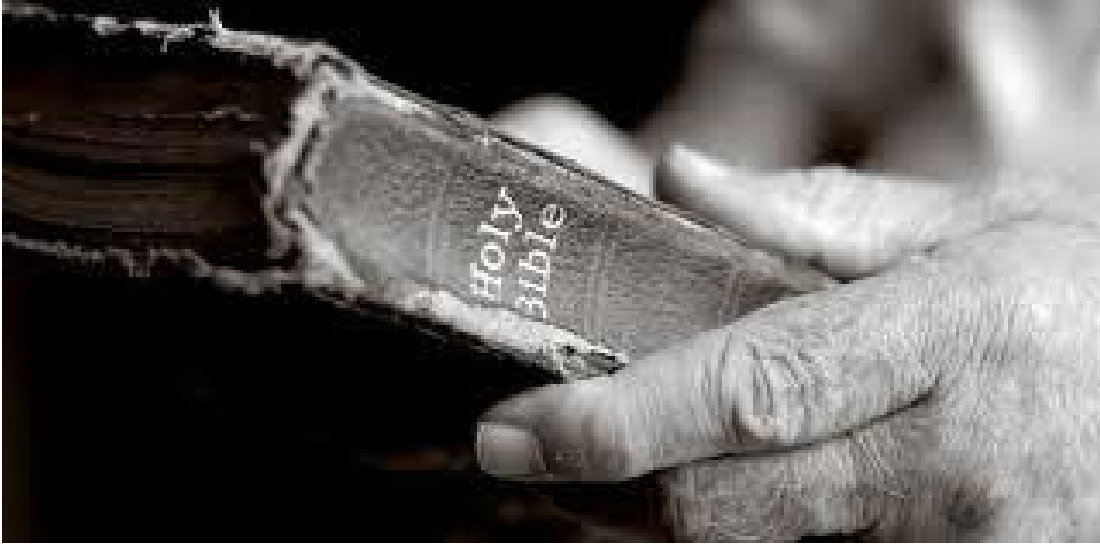

# 19<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Do you own a personal bible? Do you have a family bible? In either case, how worn out is your bible? When I was growing up, there were two prominent bibles in our home. One was a large family bible on the coffee table in the living room. Our pastor, Fr. Joe Marquart, encouraged every family in the parish to buy one of these family bibles, and my parents did. I was never allowed to touch that bible! My dad never touched it either. My mom touched it every fall, when she would open it to put in colorful maple leaves to dry and press within its pages. The other bible in my family was an old Douay Rheims bible that we called the Mulholland Family Bible. It came from Ireland and contained a genealogy of sorts of the Mulholland family; births, marriages and deaths, all written in the beautiful handwriting of my great grandmother Etta. It was worn from age....and I wasn't allowed to touch that one either! Now, I don't want you to think that we never read the Holy Scriptures in my family. Like most Catholics, we never "over used" any bible in our possession. My parents, however, were good about reading the scriptures before Mass, from their trusty St. Joseph Missal! And my parents taught me to love the scriptures by encouraging me to use the missal, which I did.

I still have both of our bibles and I open them occasionally. I also use a missal of sorts; the Magnificat for the Mass readings. But I also have a couple of personal bibles that are well broken in. I have two Catholic bibles: a New American Bible and a Revised Standard Version, which I read from daily. I encourage you to get a hold of a bible and spend some time with it each day. Take 10 to 15 minutes and just read and pray over a few passages and let the Holy Spirit speak to you as He wishes to that day. You might start with a gospel, or perhaps with the proverbs or the psalms. Take some time with your bible and come to know the word of God in a meaningful way. When you do, the Word of God, Jesus himself, will begin to come alive from the pages! And when you begin this daily practice of reading scripture, your personal bible will become well worn. But as its pages become wrinkled and faded, and as the cover starts to break down, the life of your spirit will in fact be built up! By reading the Holy Bible, you will grow strong in the Lord and your joy will be complete!

God's blessing to you in the week ahead!

At the time of communion, proceed to the credence table, under the shrine of the Blessed Mother. The sacristan will administer Holy Communion to you at the time.
