26th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“Compete well for the faith. ...Lay hold of eternal life, to which you were called... I charge you before God, who gives life to all things” (1 Tim 6)

In today’s Gospel we hear of the poor beggar, Lazarus, who would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. After they die, Lazarus is comforted, being carried away by the angels, while the rich man suffers in the flames of the netherworld. The rich man is not in eternal torments because he was rich, but because he let his wealth become his master and failed to love God and his neighbor. He was spiritually blind to the one in need right at his doorstep. And as Jesus teaches, *“Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.” (Matt 25:45).*



In a recent interview which caught the attention of the media, Pope Francis underlined the need for the Church “to heal wounds and to warm the hearts of the faithful.” Some headlines mistakenly seemed to suggest he was changing the Church’s stance on moral issues. This was not the case. Our Holy Father, in his unique and pastoral way said Church leaders should not confine their public statements to controversial social issues such as abortion, homosexuality, and contraception. The Church’s stand on those issues is already well known and clear, and the primary goal of the Church is to preach the fundamental Gospel message. The following day, in a meeting with medical professionals, the Pope asked doctors to “bear witness to and disseminate the culture of life,” criticizing a “throwaway culture” that discards human beings when they are not considered valuable, the Pope said: “Our response to this mentality is a 'yes' to life, decisive and without hesitation...Every unborn child unjustly condemned to be aborted has the face of Jesus Christ and every elderly person, sick, or even at the end of his days, bears the face of Christ." Each human life is precious; "you cannot discard!" Let us ask God for the vision to always look upon the “least ones”, to recognize the face of Jesus, and to love them as he commands.

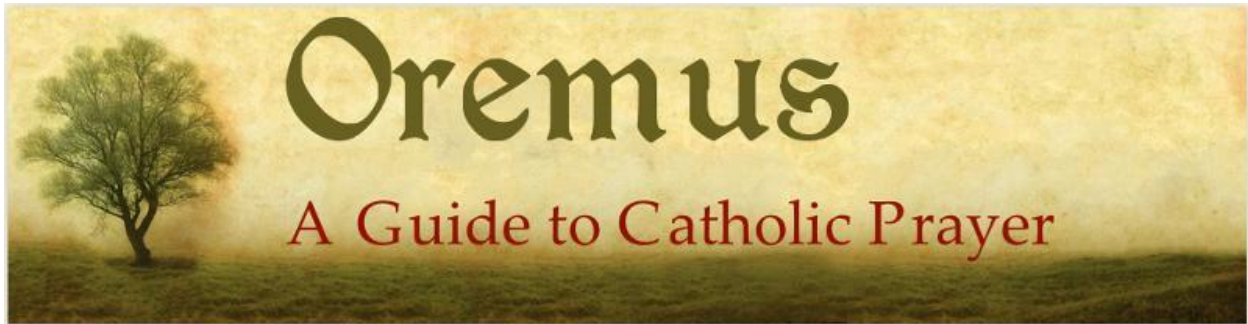

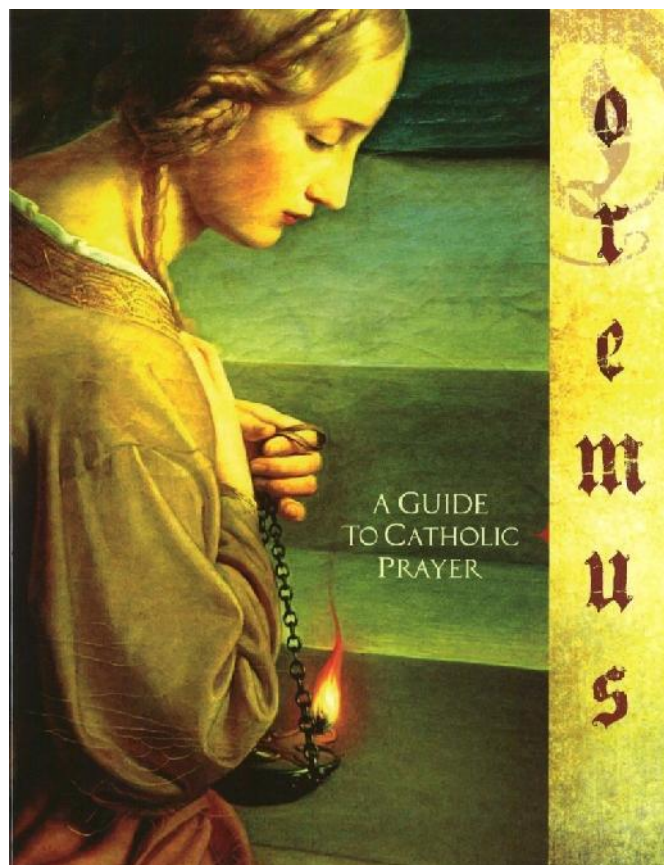
