Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

“Jesus told his disciples a parable about the necessity for them to pray always without becoming weary.” Luke 18:1

The interesting thing about this quote from Sunday’s gospel is that many people tend to do the opposite: when we get weary, it is then that we find the necessity for prayer. Jesus, however, tells us to pray always, not just when we are weary or are in need. Still, the most powerful form of prayer can come when we have those “drop to your knees” experiences and seek God and His guidance in prayer....often when things are not going well or when we need Him the most. It’s in those situations that we can be most open to the peace and consolation that the Lord so quickly gives us as a fruit of prayer.

At the end of the gospel, Jesus equates the persistence of the widow’s prayer with true faith. He does it by asking a question. He asks, “When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?” If we are true to our prayer as a source of deepening our relationship with the Lord Jesus, always, on a daily basis, then there is faith on earth; our faith, in fact! Why is this? Well, our prayer leads us to greater faith as the Lord’s grace flows through our lives and to those around us as well.

May we never grow weary of seeking the Lord’s peace in praying always!

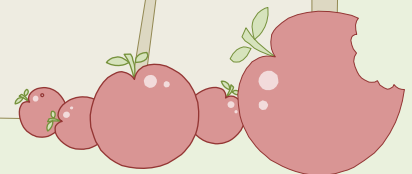

The Proclamation of the Proto-Cathedral of St. James the Greater

Birthplace of
Catholicism
in Northwest

Archbishop J. Peter Sartain, recognizing the spiritual and historical significance of St. James, will proclaim the church the Proto-Cathedral of the Archdiocese of Seattle during a very special Mass. The St. James Collegium Musicum will sing polyphony, orchestral choral works, and chants for this celebration.

From Mission to cathedral for the Diocese of Nesqually to parish church to proto-cathedral, the story of St. James in Vancouver is one of courage, grit and spiritual fulfillment.

The new title is a fitting honor for the church which has stood since 1885 as a witness to the faith of the pioneer Catholics of our diocese. It recalls the courage and self sacrifice of this missionary Church which began with the arrival of just two priests in 1838 on an unsettled frontier at the requests of French Canadian Catholics attached to the Hudson's Bay Company.

Bishop Junger dedicated St. James as the first permanent cathedral in 1885.

St. James with its beautiful interior served as cathedral for our diocese, (then known as the Diocese of Nesqually) until Bishop Edward O'Dea moved the see to Seattle and dedicated his new cathedral church on First Hill in 1907.

This wood frame St. James Church outside Fort Vancouver served as the first cathedral from 1851-1885.
