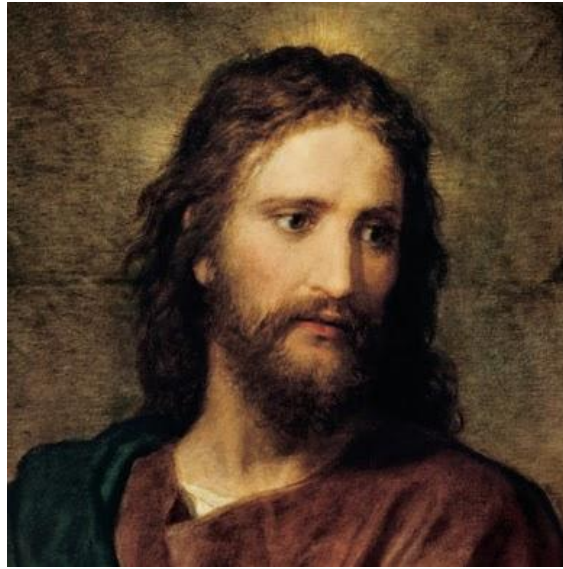


30th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

“Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations.” Matthew 28:19

Just before He ascended into heaven, the Lord Jesus gave this instruction, called the great commissioning, to His disciples; that they themselves were, in turn, called to make disciples of all nations, even to the ends of the world. He promised to be with them for all time. Of course, those first disciples responded and the result is that we too, literally at the end of the world and 2,000 years later, here in Shoreline, Washington are disciples of Jesus Christ!
