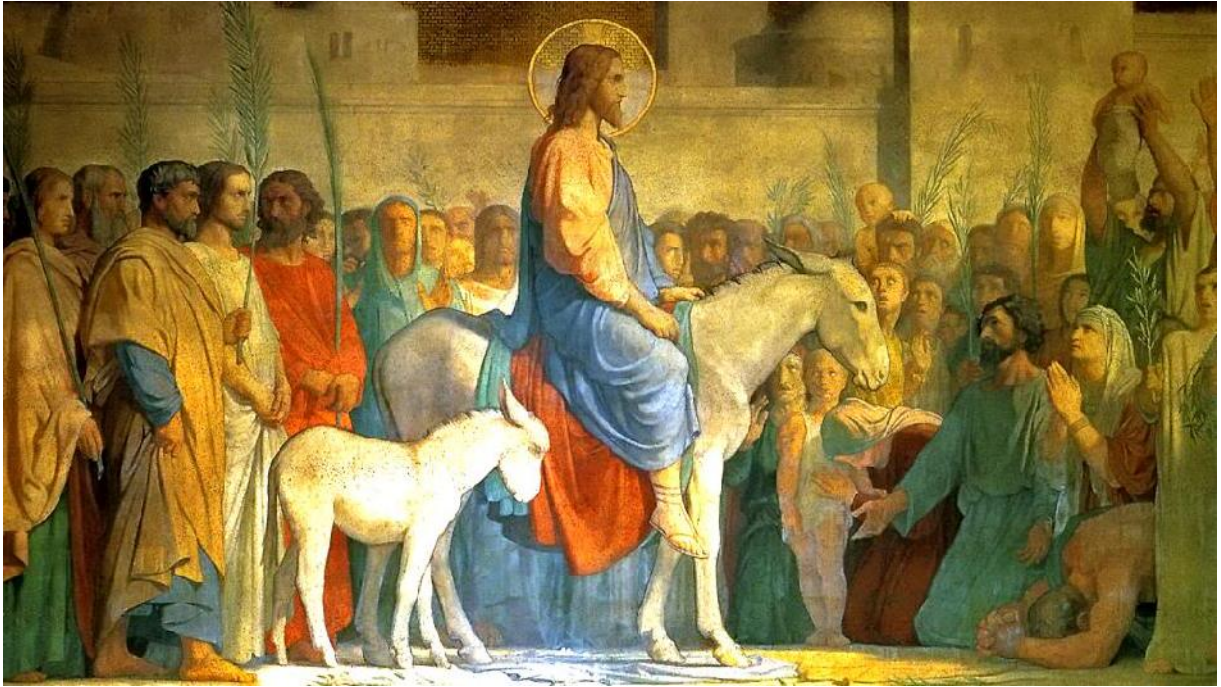

## Pastor's Letter: Palm Sunday



*Jesus' Entry into the Holy City of Jerusalem*

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Here are some beautiful words on the importance of Palm Sunday from Bishop Jacques-Benigne Bossuet, written in the late 1600's; but still true for us to this day:

“This is what we see in His entry into Jerusalem, the most striking and beautiful royal entry ever made. A man who seems to be the lowliest in consideration and power, receives from all the people, both in the royal city and in the Temple, honors greater than any ever given to a king. This is the brilliance. Yet we must not forget the humility and infirmity that were inseparable from the earthly condition of the Son of God, and we will see them too,...[in His coming passion]. With this holy festivity, they led the Savior to the middle of Jerusalem, to the holy mountain of the Temple. There He appeared as its lord and master, as the son of the royal house, the Son of God who was worshipped there. Neither Solomon, its founder, nor the high priests who officiated there had ever received equal honors.”

“We should pause here and take time to reflect upon the whole of this great spectacle.”

The good bishop is right; we must indeed pause here before we experience the events of Holy Week and the Lord's passion, death and resurrection. It's all been done for us and for our salvation! He had us in mind at all times of this most holy week! Let us pray well during these days and so prepare ourselves to receive the Lord Jesus anew in the passion of his suffering and death and in the glory of His resurrection!

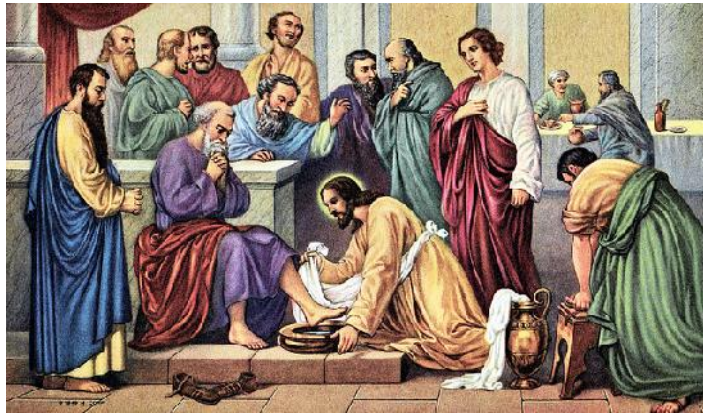

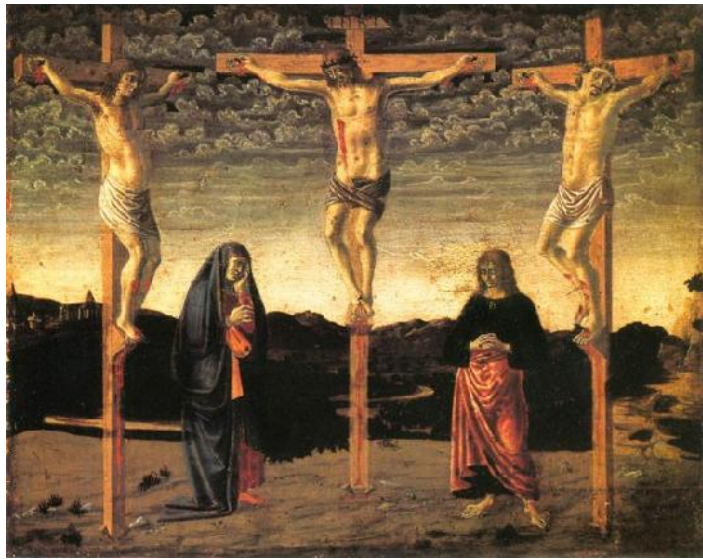

### GOOD FRIDAY IS A DAY OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE.

**Fast:** On a day of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal the other full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk & juices, are permitted. All Catholics who are 18, but not 59 years old are bound by the law of fast.

**Abstinence:** On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. All Catholics who are 14 and older are bound by the law of abstinence. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige

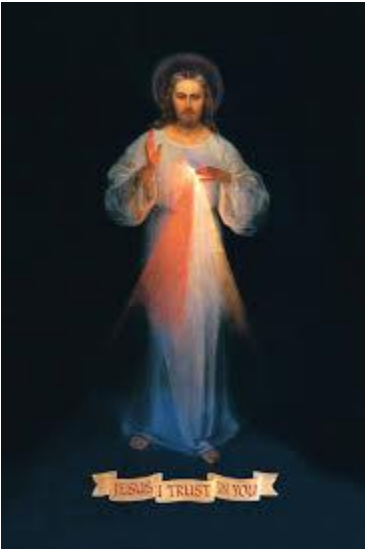


## 40 DAYS FOR LIFE SPRING CAMPAIGN ENDS – BUT THE EFFORT CONTINUES...

## WHAT IS DIVINE MERCY?



The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us — all of us. And, he wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy. The Divine Mercy message is one we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC:

**A** - Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.  
**B** - Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.  
**C** - Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.

This message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread.

**Please be aware that the tax return incident has received quite a bit of media attention and therefore has attracted the attention of unscrupulous people who would like to take advantage of the situation with different scams.**

*Please be very cautious regarding solicitations and unusual phone calls.*

## **URGENT NOTICE**

It has recently come to our attention that some Archdiocesan employees and volunteers may be victims of a national tax refund fraud. This may result in delayed or diverted refunds.

If you would like to check to see if you have been affected, please check with the IRS to see if a return has already been filed in your name.

You may do this several ways:

1) Log-onto the IRS website to check get the transcript of your refund. 1) Google: IRSGet Transcript or; 2) Call the Individual Tax Line at (800) 829-1040; or  
3) Go in-person to a local IRS office. The address in Seattle is: 915 Second Avenue, Seattle

If you find that your tax return has been compromised, here are some steps you can take:

- 1) Report the fraudulent return to the IRS.
    - a. Contact the Identity Protection Specialized Unit at (800) 908-4490.
    - b. You will also want to submit IRS Form 14039 - Identity Tax Affidavit with a copy of your driver's license.
  - 2) Check the credit reporting agencies and put fraud alerts on your credit reports.
    - a. Equifax, Experian and Transunion are the three main credit reporting agencies.
  - 3) Notify law enforcement to create a Identity Theft Report.
    - a. Submit a report about the theft to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC). Print a copy of the report, called "Identity Theft Affidavit."
    - b. File a police report with your local police station and include a copy of the Identity Theft Affidavit.
    - c. Create an Identity Theft Report with the FTC with the Identity Theft Affidavit and your police report.
