Pastor's Letter:



St. Therese of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In every Catholic Church, you will find statues of Jesus, Mary, Joseph, and most probably, St. Therese of Lisieux, the Little Flower. When she was canonized by Pope St. Pius X, he called her the greatest saint of modern times. She is a powerful intercessor on our behalf before God. And when God answers her prayers, she will sometimes send us a rose as a sign of God's goodness and grace. I have received two such roses in my life (yellow to be exact)!

Thanks to a donor, St. Mark now has a worthy shrine containing the above image of St. Therese. This is a reproduction of an oil painting done by artist Leonard Porter in 2007. The original is in the Church of St. Christopher in Staten Island, New York. Now, you really have to look for this shrine. It's located in what was an unused alcove, behind the pipe organ (in the opposite alcove of the Divine Mercy shrine). Yes, she is hidden but I think she would like it that way. In her autobiography, *Story of a Soul*, St. Therese tells us that as a young girl, she would often hide behind furniture and simply "think about God." Such pure and simple prayer! So, at St. Mark, she hides behind the organ, in the corner. Hidden and little, which are hallmarks of her spirituality. We will officially dedicate this shrine on her feast day, Wednesday, October 1, 2014.

My friends, I encourage you to seek out St. Therese in your life of prayer. Prayers to her are powerful and they are heard by God. I can attest to that on many occasions in my life. May she help our life of faith as we grow as disciples of our Lord Jesus!
