This year there are several bills that need your attention: Parental Notification: SB 5289 & HB 1493, Telemedicine: SB 5175 & HB 1403, Employer Contraceptive Mandate: SB 5026 & HB 1502, Abortion Insurance Mandate: SB 5574 & HB 1647, WA State Life at Conception Act: HB 1687. CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY PROJECT

Our students are learned about the Seven Corporal Works of Mercy through a special educational program provided by the charitable organization, *Cross Catholic Outreach*. The program is designed to teach children the meaning of charity and how to put their faith into action. Students came to understand the true meaning of "loving one's neighbor" and what the Seven Works of Mercy can mean in their own lives and the lives of others, as they perform deeds of mercy.

On a global level, the students learned about the needs of the poorest of the poor across the world and how Catholic missionaries are trying to meet those physical and spiritual needs. The students learned how they can make a difference by *raising funds* to help missionaries who work with the poorest of the poor. Below is the total amount of money raised for these charities.
