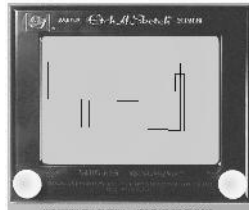

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last week in my homily I mentioned how many people believe we live in a post-Christian culture and society. In other words, there is no longer an accepted Judeo-Christian set of principles that all agree are fundamental. Instead, we live in a very secular society, founded on a form of relativism, that says you can do what you want as long as no one is harmed. It's the opposite, really, of "love your neighbor." In this situation, Christian morality and ethics is either ignored or rejected. That's why the Church's teachings on the sanctity of life, marriage, assisted suicide and the like are dismissed. In this environment, morality cannot be forced or imposed...and, in fact, it never should be. It will always be rejected when presented in that way. Rather, it should be embraced and lived, but this can only happen after a person comes to faith; faith in the Lord Jesus. As a Church, we need to go joyfully out into the world, into the mission field, with the message of faith in Jesus. When people come to faith after conversion, then Christian morality will not be a set of rules to follow, but a way to live in peace and joy. This is at the heart of the Church's mission. The mission field is ready, are you?

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION - 3RD MONTH

Thank you for praying for me. I'm now three months old now. I'm about 3 inches long and I weigh one ounce. That's not much, but I'm fully formed and can even suck my thumb! We are at the end of the first trimester! Your spiritually adopted baby is becoming very active in the womb now. Here are some things he can do: squint, swallow, move his tongue, make a tight fist if you touch his palm.

CHANGING THE DISCUSSION ABOUT ADOPTION

Typical statement to a woman considering adoption as a practical option: "There are no good families"

Reality: Adoptive couples must have a home study by an approved adoption agency, an FBI background check, training, meeting with a social worker, and visits to their home. Birthparents can choose who will raise the child.

Let's start making adoption the loving choice for an unplanned pregnancy. In our country, currently less than 1% of unplanned pregnancies result in adoption while 48% end in an abortion.

He later served on faculty at the Theology of the Body Institute in Pennsylvania, and the Center for Biblical Studies in Tallahassee, Florida, where he taught courses on healing, sexuality, and marriage.

Schuchts is the founder and president of the John Paul II Healing Center in Tallahassee, Florida, where he and his team offer healing and training conferences for many audiences including priests, seminarians, religious, married people, and lay people of all ages and stages of life. Among the most frequently attended are "Healing the Whole Person," (a healing conference) "Unveiled" (a marriage retreat) and "Holy Desire," a conference he offers in seminaries. Schuchts and his wife Margie have been married for thirty-seven years and have two married daughters and seven grandchildren. They live in Tallahassee, Florida.
