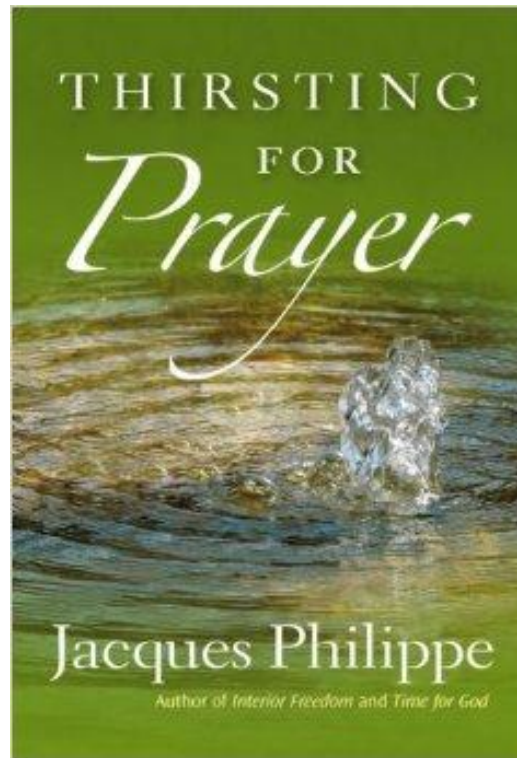

SEATTLE HIGH SCHOOL IMPLANTING BIRTH CONTROL DEVICES

Since 2010 a local, public high school, Chief Sealth International, has been offering contraceptives to its students. Now the "choice" includes implanting intrauterine devices (IUD). The IUD is known as a long acting reversible contraception, and may even act as an abortifacient. Funding for the contraception is being provided through a Medicaid program known as Take Charge and a non-profit, NeighborCare. Students can opt to receive the device or other method free of cost and without their parent's insurance or permission. Please pray for those girls who are being misled by the "freedom" contraception provides them and for their parents who may not know what their daughters are doing. 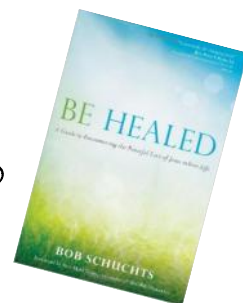

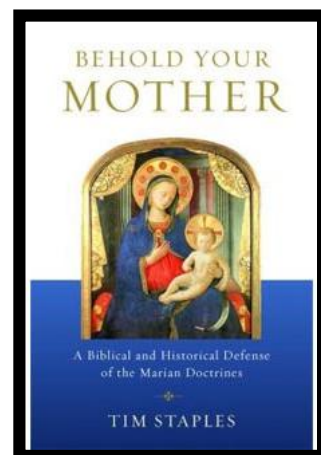
