Jubilee of Mercy



Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There are many quotes from the saints that “explain” the Holy Trinity; one God, three Divine Persons. But here is Saint Faustina’s experience of the Trinity through her personal prayer:

“I knew more distinctly than ever before the Three Divine Persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. But their being, their equality, and their majesty are one. My soul is in communion with these Three; but I do not know how to express this in words; yet my soul understands this well. Whoever is united to One of the Three Persons is thereby united to the whole Blessed Trinity, for this Oneness is indivisible (Diary 472).

Today I was in heaven, in spirit, and I saw its inconceivable beauties and the happiness that awaits us after death. I saw how all creatures give ceaseless praise and glory to God. I saw how great is happiness in God, which spreads to all creatures making them happy; and then all the glory and praise which springs from this happiness returns to its source; and they enter into the depths of God, contemplating the inner life of God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, whom they will never comprehend nor fathom.

This source of happiness is unchanging in its essence, but it is always new, gushing forth happiness for all creatures. Now I understand St. Paul who said, 'Eye has not seen, not has ear heard, nor has it entered into the heart of man what God has prepared for those who love Him' (Diary 777)."
