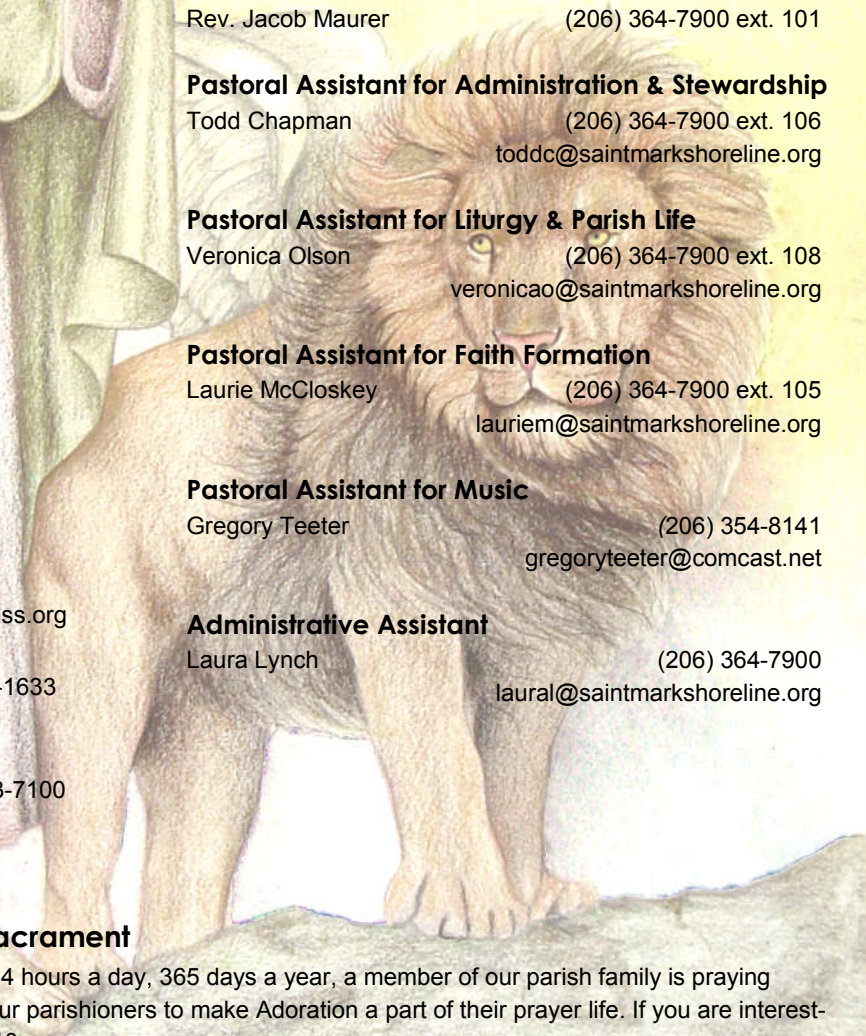

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

If you, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But with you is found forgiveness, O God of Israel.

Cf. Ps 130 (129): 3-4

The healing of Naaman in 2 Kings is a story of the humility necessary to accept God's care. Just prior to the passage we read today, Naaman had almost refused Elisha's instructions, furious that the prophet would not speak with him and that his directions were simply to wash seven times in the Jordan.

Only at his servant's pleading—"My father, if the prophet told you to do something extraordinary, would you not do it? All the more since he told you, 'Wash, and be clean?'"—did Naaman let go of his pride and enter into the waters. Upon emerging his skin was clean of the leprosy that had plagued him.

How often do we find ourselves echoing Naaman's outrage, expecting and even demanding something flashing or earthshattering. In His kindness, God offers us ordinary means to receive extraordinary graces.

Do you wish to be purified of your iniquities? What ordinary means—daily prayer, confession, fasting, abstinence, almsgiving—will you humbly accept in order to be clean?

The *Anima Christi*, often offered as a prayer of thanksgiving during the period of silence at Mass after having received communion:

Soul of Christ, sanctify me.
Body of Christ, save me.
Blood of Christ, inebriate me.
Water from the side of Christ, wash me.
Passion of Christ, strengthen me.
O Good Jesus, hear me.
Within Thy wounds hide me.
Suffer me not to be separated from thee.
From the malignant enemy defend me.
In the hour of my death call me.
And bid me come unto Thee,
That with all Thy saints,
I may praise thee
Forever and ever.
Amen.

John de Brebeuf, Isaac Jogues and their companions (October 19) were French Jesuit missionaries sent to Canada and North America. Six priests and two laymen, they came to preach the Gospel to the Iroquois and Huron tribes.

They were captured and tortured—and on at least one occasion, had the choice to abandon their mission. Issac Jogues expressed his desire to continue on even in the face of possible death. They were eventually martyred in what is now Auriesville, New York.
