SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY



Dear Brother and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Trinity Sunday. Today we celebrate the Fundamental dogma and mystery of our faith . The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, in whose name every Christian is baptized. The dogma of faith which forms the object of the feast is this: There is one God and in this one God there are three Divine Persons; the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Sometimes I am asked, "Father, what does the SOLT after your name mean?" I explain that it's the name of the religious order I belong to: the Society of Our Lady of the Most Holy Trinity. Similar to how the Jesuits, the Society of Jesus, have "SJ" after their name.

This weekend, in a sense, is SOLT's feast day. In the Church's year, Saturday is celebrated as a memorial of Our Lady. This is because Mary prepares us for Jesus. Saturday is a day which prepares us for Sunday. Mary shows us how to worship the Trinity. So the Saturday before the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity would be the appropriate day for the feast of Our Lady of the Most Holy Trinity.

May the prayers and love of Our Lady of the Most Holy Trinity intercede for the Church.

CONGRESSMAN INTRODUCES BILL FOR "PROTECTION FOR PAIN-CAPABLE UNBORN CHILDREN"

WASHINGTON (May 17, 2013) -- Congressman Trent Franks (R-Az.) announced that he will advance legislation to provide protection nationwide for unborn children who have the capacity to experience pain while being aborted, a capacity defined in the bill as existing by 20 weeks fetal age. Franks, who chairs the U.S. House Judiciary Committee's Subcommittee on the Constitution and Civil Justice, is the prime sponsor of the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act. The current version of the bill, which garnered a majority vote in the House in 2012, would apply only to the District of Columbia. In a press release issued last Friday, May 17, Franks announced his intention to revise the bill (H.R. 1797) in committee to cover the entire nation.

In a nationwide poll of 1,003 registered voters in March, The Polling Company found that 64% would support a law such as the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act prohibiting abortion after 20 weeks -- when an unborn baby can feel pain - unless the life of the mother was in danger. Only 30% opposed such legislation. CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION

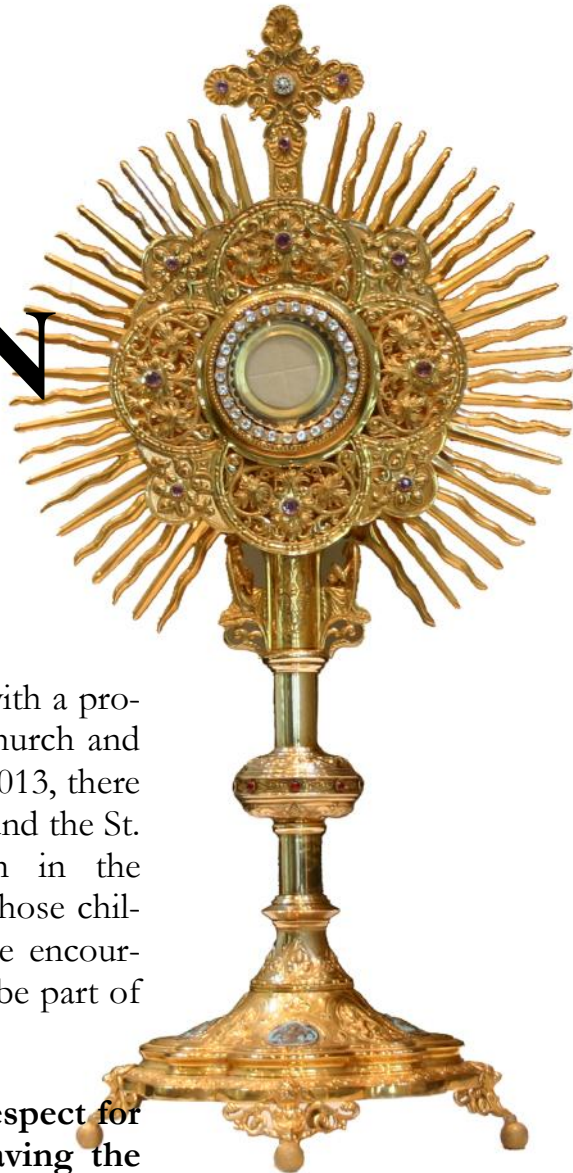
