In the Letter to the Galatians, St. Paul tells us: “For freedom Christ set us free; so stand firm and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery. For you were called for freedom, brothers and sisters.”

This coming week, we celebrate Independence Day on July 4<sup>th</sup>, and we give thanks to God for the freedoms we enjoy as Americans. We are truly blessed with the gift of liberty. What was so clear to our American patriots and founding fathers in the late 1700’s, was that this inherent freedom comes only from God, and no other source. Today, this unfortunately is not so clear to many Americans, where God is often denied or ignored.

## LOW GLUTEN HOSTS AVAILABLE FOR CONSECRATION

If you have health issues associated with celiac disease and you are not able to receive the Precious Blood of the Lord at Holy Communion, you may request that a *low gluten* host be consecrated at the Mass you are attending. The procedure is simple: Prior to the beginning of Mass, ask a sacristan that a low gluten host be consecrated for you at Mass. At the time of communion, proceed to the credence table, under the shrine of the Blessed Mother. The sacristan will administer Holy Communion to you at the time. If you have any questions, please speak to a sacristan after Mass.
