Baptism Information Form (Baptism of infants and small children: birth to 7 years)

Through the Sacrament of Baptism, parents and Godparents assume an important responsibility to teach their child to know and love the Lord Jesus and His Church. These lessons of faith are best taught in the home on a daily basis. We must not only know our faith, but we must live it too!

Baptism preparation during the pandemic is offered on an individual basis. Parents are encouraged to begin preparations prior to the birth of their child.

Steps to have your child baptized at St. Mark Parish:

- 1. Verify that you are registered at the parish. If not officially registered, please do so at this time.
- 2. Read and sign this information form and return it to the parish.
- 3. Fill out the separate Baptism Registration form and return it to the parish.
- 4. Attach a copy of the child's birth certificate to the registration. A photocopy is preferable.
- 5. Submit the Godparent form one for each Godparent, maximum of two.
- 5. Call Kirk Altenhofen at the office to register for baptism preparation and set a date for baptism.

Godparents:

- A Godparent must be an active, participating Catholic, which means they are baptized, confirmed and if married, be married in the Church. They also must be attending Mass each Sunday and living the sacramental life of the Church.
- 2. Only one Godparent is needed but two are often chosen. A Godparent cannot be a parent of the one being baptized. If you chose two, one must be male and one must be female.
- 3. Good qualities of Godparents are: someone who knows and practices their faith, someone who continues to grow in their faith and someone who will help you raise your child in the faith.
- 4. It is not only an honor, but a serious responsibility to be a Godparent.
