The pressure cooker of our current circumstances, of living all day in our homes, of reading the latest news, of interacting with so many & so much emotion on social media can stir up the worst temptations in our minds and hearts.

To the archbishop's encouragement, I would add this: go to Mary! We are blessed to have been entrusted to the sacred heart of Mary – by her Son Himself, even as He was suffering on the cross: "Behold your Mother". How often as children we rushed into our mother's arms when we had a scraped knee, our feelings were wounded, or to petition her for the latest object of our heart's desire. Mary's motherhood is also offered to us to assist us in these and so many ways. The <u>rosary</u>, <u>Marian hymns</u>, or even <u>Marian consecration</u> are ways we can turn to her from wherever we may be.

I would also like to invite you to a new weekday live stream that I am starting. Unlike the Saturday noon live Q&A (which will continue on!), this live stream will be more catechetically oriented. My desire is to join with you in exploring various aspects of our Catholic faith. I will spend some time presenting on various topics and then open the remainder of the time for questions & answers about the theme of the week. Our first one will be **this Friday, May 15th at 3pm**. We will be talking about the Church & daily prayer, especially focusing on the history & practice of the Liturgy of the Hours and the rosary.
