



You are just, O Lord, and your judgment is right; treat your servant in accord with your merciful love.

Fraternal correction is a phrase that elicits excitement & anxiety. Excitement because we hunger for justice and to see error corrected, anxiety because we fear confrontation. Jesus clearly lays out the how of fraternal correction in today's Gospel. Matthew 18 is a passage that we all ought to reference often.

So why does Jesus pair these instructions with the forgiveness of sins and with the assertion of God's presence where two or three are gathered? And, why does the Church tie His words with Ezekiel's and Paul's exhortations?

In short, because refusing to help another to return to the way of the Lord is to exclude them, to choose to leave them in error - to allow them to persist in the path away from salvation. If we choose not correct each other's errors, we are responsible for their fall.

We should approach this responsibility with humility and grace - how easy it would be to indulge in self-righteousness and drive each other further from the love of God. But we must not fall into the sin of Cain - Jesus

teaches us that we <u>are</u> our brother's keeper.

We must care for each other in warning against sin & encouraging virtue. May the Lord to grant us the grace to receive and offer fraternal correction with courage and charity.
