



₩JMJ ₩ WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

I am the salvation of the people, says the Lord. Should they cry to me in any distress, I will hear them, and I will be their Lord for ever.

I remember a story from a childhood storybook about a woman who went to the local grocer for supplies. As the grocer was weighing her produce, he gave a might sneeze - and the scale moved dramatically. 'My, my!' said the woman, 'that was a five pound sneeze!' - for his sneeze revealed that he had his finger slyly placed to push down scale.

We expect some sort of justice in our dealings with each other. How many times did we cry 'that's not fair!' to our peers, our teachers, or our parents as children? The dark side of this



desire for justice is that generosity can seem unfair - prompting our objections anew.

Generosity always includes justice - the demands of fairness are clearly met in today's Gospel - and then it goes *beyond* justice! This is often alien to our experience. Who **does** this? Well, God certainly does! Moreover, the point is that He does so for each and everyone one of us - we need not worry that we will be cheated or miss out. We need only ask the Lord and He will respond generously. September 21 is the feast of Saint Matthew the Apostle. The son of Alpheus and a tax collector, little is known about him, though his account of Jesus' life is the first of the four Gospels.



Saint Matthew is often

depicted as one of the four living creatures from Revelation 4:7, a winged man. This symbol is visible in the upper left of the reredos in the sanctuary of Saint Mark parish.
