



The focus is on those individuals, children, families and communities struggling with poverty and the effects of intolerance and racism. They partner with other organizations and individuals to work for justice.

Our annual collection for Catholic Community Services is next weekend, December 6, the second Sunday of Advent. During Advent we are called, in a special way, to respond to the needs of the poor and the vulnerable
