





Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.

Cf. Phil 4: 4-5

“The spirit of the Lord God is upon me”

Who among us would dare to make this proclamation, uttered first by Isaiah and later echoed in the proclamation of Mary to Elizabeth at the visitation? By what justification could we have audacity to lay claim to the honor of being so blessed by the Lord?

John the Baptist has the answer: the baptism of the One for Whom he prepares the way - not simply a baptism of water, but with the Holy Spirit!



Though Isaiah and Mary were blessed in ways unique to their vocation, we legitimately proclaim even greater blessings - we who have regular access to the sacraments, for many of us the majority of our lives. The spirit of the Lord God truly is upon us.

Perhaps we need to flip the script in our minds: how could we dare **not** to proclaim God's goodness, how could we have the audacity **not** to proclaim His wondrous goodness to us?!

This gaudete (rejoice!) Sunday, may we be heartened and emboldened to do just that.

In his December 8th apostolic letter *Patris Corde*, Pope Francis has declared a jubilee year in honor of Saint Joseph, as we celebrate 150th anniversary of his being made the patron saint of the Church.

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Dear friends,

Last week we summarized the core questions around the moral issues of using vaccines. We briefly touched on the Church teaching that vaccines are safe, moral, and indeed part of our responsibility as Christians.

“From the clinical point of view, it should also be reiterated that treatment with vaccines, despite the very rare side effects (the events that occur most commonly are mild and due to an immune response to the vaccine itself), is safe and effective. No correlation exists between the administration of the vaccine and the onset of Autism.”

- *Note on Italian vaccine issue*, Pontifical Academy for Life

This week we touch on a more general but nonetheless common worry - are vaccines **safe** to use? Especially in recent years there has been much speculation about a potential link between vaccines and illness, particularly autism. In its 2017 *Note on Italian vaccine issue*, the Pontifical Academy for Life reiterated that **vaccines are safe and effective**.

One name that often comes up in this area is Dr. Theresa Deisher. Dr. Deisher is to be especially lauded for her efforts to support an ethically sound vaccine to replace the current MMR (**M**easles, **M**umps, and **R**uebella) vaccine, which has direct ties to fetal stem cells obtained from abortion. However, where Dr. Deisher loses credibility - and in fact finds herself in opposition to the Pontifical Academy for Life (among other voices) - is in her assertion that vaccines cause autism.

This claim has been addressed many times over, but for those who would like to dive into the details around why this assertion is false, I recommend the series started by the contributors of the blog ‘Rational Catholic’ ([Part I](#) & [Part II](#) are currently available, along with supplementary articles linked at the conclusion of each part). Both knowledgeable & faithful, the writers at Rational Catholic highlight many of the errors in Dr. Deisher’s studies and conclusions.

Taking in the facts of vaccine safety, may we also pray for the peace of the Christ in our hearts.

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

In his December 8th apostolic letter *Patris Corde*, Pope Francis has declared a jubilee year in honor of Saint Joseph. With this jubilee year comes an opportunity for the Christian faithful to receive a plenary indulgence. Although the Apostolic Penitentiary has not yet released an English translation of their instructions, the following is a rough translation of the relevant instructions:

Plenary indulgence is granted under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father) to the faithful who, in a spirit detached from any sin, participate in the Year of St. Joseph on occasions and in the way indicated by this Apostolic Penitentiary.

Those who do one of the following:

- meditating for at least 30 minutes in the prayer of the Our Father or who participate in a spiritual retreat of at least one day that include a meditation on Saint Joseph
- following St. Joseph's example, perform a work of bodily or spiritual mercy
- pray the holy rosary in families and among the bride & groom
- entrusts his work daily to the protection of St. Joseph and to every believe who invokes with his prayers the intercession of the worker of Nazareth
- pray the litany of St. Joseph (for Latin tradition), or the Akathistos to St. Joseph, in whole or at least part of it (for byzantine tradition), or some other prayer to St. Joseph, typical of the other liturgical traditions, for the persecuted Church ad intra and ad extra and for the relief of all Christians who suffer all forms of persecution
- pray any prayer or act of piety legitimately approved in honor of St. Joseph, for example "To you, O Blessed Joseph" [**printable prayer insert included in the bulletin - Fr. Maurer**], especially on March 19 and May 1, feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, the Sunday of St. Joseph (according to Byzantine tradition), the 19th of each month and every Wednesday, the day dedicated to the memory of the Saint according to Latin tradition.

In the current context of health emergency, the gift of plenary indulgence extends particularly to the elderly, the sick, the dying and all those who for legitimate reasons cannot leave their home, who, in the spirit detached from any sin and with the intention of fulfilling, as soon as possible, the three usual conditions, in their own home or wherever the impediment holds them back, pray an act of mercy in honor of St. Joseph, comfort of the sick and patron saint of good death, confidently offering God the pains and difficulties of his life.

Prayer to St. Joseph

To you, O blessed Joseph,
do we come in our tribulation,
and having implored the help of your most holy Spouse,
we confidently invoke your patronage also.
Through that charity which bound you
to the Immaculate Virgin Mother of God
and through the paternal love
with which you embraced the Child Jesus,

which Jesus Christ has purchased by his Blood,
and with your power and strength to aid us in our
necessities.

O most watchful guardian of the Holy Family,
defend the chosen children of Jesus Christ;
O most loving father, ward off from us

O our most mighty protector, be kind to us
and from heaven assist us in our struggle
with the power of darkness.

As once you rescued the Child Jesus from deadly peril,
so now protect God's Holy Church



The liturgy is not something the priest does and the people passively receive.

Through the Paschal Mystery of Christ's death and resurrection, God has redeemed us. This is the very heart of the Good News which the apostles proclaimed and which the Church proclaims today. This free gift of God gives meaning to our lives: Indeed, "our birth would have been no gain, had we not been redeemed" (from the Easter Proclamation, Roman Missal). And through the liturgy, this great work of redemption is ongoing. In the liturgy, Christ continues to act on our behalf. When the Church gathers to celebrate Eucharist, something happens: Christ, truly present, acts through, with, and for us, continuing the work of redemption.

The faithful express the mystery of Christ. The liturgy is not something the priest does and the people passively receive. As Catholics, liturgy is the very language we speak. Gathering to celebrate the liturgy Sunday after Sunday is our primary means of coming to know Christ and of expressing that mystery through the offering of our time and devotion. Our gatherings in turn reflect the mystery of Christ, who acts through us in the world today. Through our conscious participation in the Eucharist, we learn to live in closer communion with Christ.
