
₩JMJ¥ WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor. *Cf. Ps 25 (24): 15-16*

This Sunday begins the first of the three **scrutinies**. This rite, traditionally celebrated on the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent, is a time of purification from sin and temptation for the elect who will be received into the Church at the Easter vigil Mass.

For those who follow the readings at Sunday Masses where the scrutinies are celebrated, you will notice that the readings are from Cycle A



despite the fact that we are in Cycle B.

This is because the scrutinies correspond to the accounts from the Gospel of John of the Samaritan

woman, the man born blind, and the raising of Lazarus. These particular stories speak to the power of Christ over sin & death, as well as the response of those to whom He ministers.

While we ourselves are not taking part in the scrutinies, this is an opportune time for each of us to consider how we yet need to be purified of attachment to sin. As the prayer of exorcism is prayed over the elect, we too might ask for the Lord to excise from our hearts the evils that we allow to reside there. May we join with the elect in being brought closer to Christ. March 8 is the optional memorial of **Saint John of God**. Prone to impulsive decisions of the heart even from a young age, Saint John ran away from home after hearing a priest talk about adventures in the new world.



Most of his life was going from one thing to another as he realized his need for conversion and felt various promptings to live more perfectly and assist others. May we follow his example, responding eagerly when the Holy Spirit calls us to conversion and service.

Starting last week and lasting through the Lenten season, Saint Mark parish will be offering **solemn exposition and benediction** of the Blessed Sacrament each Wednesday from 5:00 pm to 6:00 pm.

While exposition is not necessary for

adoration (Jesus is always present in the tabernacle!), it is nonetheless a special blessing to adore in this particular way.

Regardless of how long you can stay, this is a wonderful opportunity to be with the Lord and each other in prayer & worship.

Shedding Light on Pornography, Part II

Pornography is a not-so secret dark issue for many. The combination of easy internet access, more time at home and much available content has produced a situation in which on-demand video of virtually any act is available for free–at the click of a mouse.

Pornography hurts adults, children, couples, families and society. For adolescents, pornography hinders the development of a healthy sexuality and among adults it distorts attitudes and social realities. In families pornography use leads to marital dissatisfaction, infidelity, separation and divorce.

Pornography is addictive. Neuroscientists can map the biological substrate of this addiction in the brain. Frequent users, men, women and teens tend to become desensitized to the type of pornography they use, become bored by it, and progress to more extreme forms. Prolonged consumption of pornography by men produces stronger notions of women as commodities or objects and correlates with a tolerance of unhealthy, including violent, behaviors.

Women are less likely both to use pornography and to go from the viewing of pornography to the seeking out the experiences portrayed but are at a higher risk of seeking connections in real life with those they encounter online. For adolescents not only does the use of pornography hinder healthy development, but results in sexual self-esteem plummeting while a sense of shame rises. A significant relationship in adolescents exists between frequent pornography use and feelings of loneliness and major forms of depression; it disorients them during that developmental phase when they are most vulnerable to uncertainty regarding their beliefs and values.


Games & Grace
