

# ₩JMJ¥ WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast. *Cf. Is 66: 10-11* 

Providentially, this week combines two joyful moments in the life of the Church, Laetare Sunday and the Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Husband of Mary.

Taking its title from the antiphon (above) that starts with 'rejoice', Laetare Sunday marks the mid-way point of Lent. The penitential violet color is briefly replaced with rose as



we anticipate the white of Easter (the color rose is created by the blending of violet and white). We even get to finish off the week with Joseph's solemnity, which happens to abrogate the normal Friday obligation to fast from meat (see Code of Canon Law 1251)!

With Saint Joseph, may we rejoice in the triumph of Christ over sin & death and ask his intercession that we may draw closer to Him. March 14, 2021

# March 19 is the Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Though this solemn celebration is honored every year, it holds special significance during this Year of Saint Joseph pronounced by Pope Francis on December 8 of last year.

In his letter *Patris corde* ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis speaks about the courage of Saint Joseph in agreeing to take on the role & responsibilities of being Jesus' earthly father. He also highlights the largely quiet nature of Saint Joseph's role in Scripture:

Each of us can discover in Joseph – the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence – an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble. Saint Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation. A word of recognition and of gratitude is due to them all.

There is a popular devotional that the pope also explores in his letter: the phrase "Go to Joseph". How might we more consciously seek refuge in Saint Joseph's care and entrust ourselves to his fatherly affection?

Concluding his reflection with the traditional 'Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer', Pope Francis reminds us that approaching Jesus' earthly father is both simple and profound: "We need only ask Saint Joseph for the grace of graces: our conversion."

Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Foster Father of Jesus, pray for us!

# Shedding Light on Pornography, Part III

Pornography is a not-so secret dark issue for many. It damages the fabric of our society through damaging families and communities alike.

The family is a foundation of society. Within the family children's values are formed. Parents are the first and most influential teachers a child has. The family is where children learn skills, morals and values that help shape who they are. The virtues a child learns within the family, supported by their school and their church, they then apply as adults to their interactions with their community, their work and to society both politically and socially. Pornography can result in the devaluation of monogamy, marriage and child rearing. Prolonged exposure to pornography can foster dissatisfaction with a spouse's affection. In survey data collected from divorce lawyers in Chicago, it was observed that 56% of divorce cases involved one party having an obsessive interest in pornographic websites. Co-parenting is difficult enough for even the most dedicated divorced parents, but the added stress of any addiction can have disastrous effects for the children in the family.

Sexually oriented businesses - pornography stores, strip clubs, etc. - deleteriously affect their surrounding communities financially. A study in Centralia, Washington found that after a sexually oriented business opened the serious crime (violent crime, auto theft and arson) rate rose significantly in the vicinity of that address. These businesses affect property values. The closer a property is to a sexually oriented business the more its value depreciates. A study of commercial property from Dallas, Texas found that property sales were significantly lower per square foot in areas in close proximity to sexually oriented businesses.
