Proclaiming the Year of the Family Part I

Pope Francis established the Year of the Family to help strengthen faith and live God's joy more fruitfully in family life. The Year of the Family began on March 19, 2021, on the Solemnity of St. Joseph and will conclude on June 26, 2022, on the occasion of the tenth World Meeting of Families in Rome with the Holy Father.

We can celebrate without traveling to Rome!

Pope Francis' five goals for The Year of the Family

1) Share the content of the Apostolic Exhortation Amoris Laetitia more widely.

2) Proclaim that the sacrament of marriage is a gift that contains in itself a transforming power of human love.3) "Evangelize and catechize inside the family" (AL 200).4) Foster awareness to young people about the joy of family life.

5) Broaden the vision and scope of the family, including married couples, children, young people, the elderly and situations of family fragility. In response to this, Pope Francis instituted a Church-wide celebration of a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. Beginning in 2021, it will be held on the fourth Sunday of July, close to the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus.


