



As for me, in justice I shall behold your face; I shall be filled with the vision of your glory.

On Pentecost, after consultation with the new Archdiocesan Pastoral Council, Archbishop Etienne launched the Pastoral Plan. You can watch his introductory video online at <u>https://vimeo.com/553104162</u>. The archbishop specifically speaks to our commission to bring others to an encounter with Jesus, particularly through the sacraments and the scriptures.

Over the last several months, our parish staff has been reflecting on various areas where we might restore and renew our parish mission. In examining their ministerial roles, each staff



member has come up with different ways in which they will be working to help provide new opportunities for our community to grow in love of Christ and in care for each other.

Over the coming weeks and months, we will be going through a similar process of reflection and discernment as a parish. Every community faces the temptation of maintaining a status quo, of simply doing what has always been done. If we've learned anything over the last year, we know that we must be ready to adapt and change as we look to the future, together.

The archdiocese has three areas of focus, with questions in each for our reflection. I hope you'll reflect on each - maybe one a day asking God to inspire us to deeper conversion. July 11, 2021 July 14th marks the memorial of Saint Kateri Tekakwitha. Kateri, a member of the Mohawk people, converted to Catholicism at the age of nineteen. She took a vow of perpetual virginity for the remainder of her life, dying at the age of twenty-four.



Especially in light of the recently discovered unmarked children's graves in Canada, let us pray for all Native Americans, that they may know Christ's love for and our solidarity with them. Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, pray for us.

At Archbishop Etienne's direction, the Archdiocese of Seattle has started a process of pastoral planning, which you can read about at the archdiocesan website, <u>https://</u> <u>archseattle.org</u>. It has three areas of focus:

- Encounter Jesus Christ
- Accompany each another
- <u>Live the Gospel</u>

There are also four value statements: 'faith in action', 'hope in resurrection', 'truth in love' and 'unity in diversity'. I encourage you to read through this plan as we unpack it.

St. Mark Online Giving Upgrade

Our Online Giving system is getting an upgrade to a newer, easier-to-use platform.

If you currently give online you will soon receive an email with instructions on how to log-in to the new system.

Best of all, your existing payment and donation information will be migrated over so you will not have to set up your gifts again!

Keep an eye on your email for more information coming very soon.

If you are not yet giving online, please consider it! Giving online is safe and secure and has resulted in many benefits to the parish, particularly as we have weathered the pandemic.

Since we began our online giving program at St. Mark in April of 2010, total gifts have amounted to \$2,250,000. This year to date, total gifts were \$271,000, so we averaged \$22,583 each month in 2021 including all funds (Stewardship, St. Vincent de Paul, Lion's Fund, etc.) January through June.

Investment in the Church in Latin America

Catholics all across the US, through last year's special collection for the USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops), have made possible \$2.5 million in grants to support the Church in Latin America. "The Church in Latin America has suffered greatly from political oppression, civil war, economic turmoil, and societal neglect of those on the margins," said Bishop Octavio Cisneros, retired auxiliary bishop of Brooklyn and chairman of the Subcommittee on the Church in Latin America in a recent post on USCCB's website. After the Second Vatican Council, Catholics in the United States answered the call of the Holy Father to support ministry to our sisters and brothers there through the Collection for the Church in Latin America. Our Church is currently blessed to have a pope from Latin America, who has lived among the poorest of the poor, and renewed the call to solidarity with them.

Donations from parishioners in the United States not only strengthen Catholic ministries from Cuba to Peru, but they also demonstrate a love that strengthens the kingdom of God.

Some examples of our faith in action are that in Paraguay the Roman Missal will be translated into the language of the indigenous Guarani people, enabling them to worship in their native tongue and that in Venezuela, older teens who are discerning a call to the priesthood will attend retreats to help them on this spiritual journey. Thank you for your support (in 2020) of this important mission!

May it unite me more closely to you, the One true God, and lead me safely through death to everlasting happiness with You.


