

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

- Father Jacob Maurer

See, I have God for my help. The Lord sustains my soul. I will sacrifice to you with willing heart, and praise your name, O Lord, for it is good.

Cf. Ps 54 (53): 6, 8

What's the most difficult thing about being a priest?' Whenever it comes up, this question is one of the easiest to answer: the hardest part of priestly ministry is watching people turn away from what is good, true, and beautiful to choose - knowingly or not - that which will only bring them pain and sorrow.

This will undoubtedly ring true with anyone who has children, especially adult children.



There comes a point when help can only be offered - imposing it would make things worse! When rejected or ignored, parents can only watch as their son or daughter actively place themselves in harm's way, or even bring it upon themselves. Sometimes that damage is temporary - other times it leaves scars that last for a very long time.

As the saying goes, 'you can lead a horse to water, but you can't make him drink'. At some point we must allow ourselves to be helped, admitting that we need a shepherd to guide us.

Happily, that responsibility has been eagerly and lovingly accepted by Jesus, the Good Shepherd. May we allow Him to help us, to carry us, so that we may know true happiness.

By Church law, every cleric is required to make an annual retreat. Though She does not mandate the same for the laity, regular retreats from



one's regular routine would serve anyone well.

A retreat need not be in a designated place or with a guided program - though many will find that helpful. Sufficient to simply take time to disconnect, spending a day at a church not one's own (at Saint Jame's cathedral or Holyrood cemetery, for example) with a simple plan of quiet prayer and reflection. Jesus' invitation to "rest a while" is for us all.

July 22 is the feast of Saint Mary Magdalene. Much about her life is lost to time, but we know that seven demons were cast out of her by Jesus, that she followed Him throughout His earthly ministry, and that she was the first to see Him after His resurrection from the dead.

Among other things, the life and faith of Mary Magdalene reminds us that Christ

reaches out to all who are open to receive Him, regardless of circumstance. As she did, may we seek - and find! - the Lord.

Federal Moratorium on Federal Executions

The Department of Justice announced a moratorium on federal executions after reviewing its policies and procedures regarding the use of the death penalty. In response, Archbishop Paul Coakley of Oklahoma City, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development and Archbishop Joseph Naumann of Kansas City, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Pro-Life Activities, issued the following statement:

"The Catholic Church has consistently taught that every person is created in the image and likeness of God, and for this reason we consistently uphold the sacred dignity of all human life. The U.S. bishops have also long called for an end to the death penalty, and we do so in unity with Pope Francis who has also advocated for an end to capital punishment globally.

"The news of the Department of Justice's moratorium on federal executions is a welcome step, and we must also tirelessly continue to advocate for the abolition of the death penalty from both our state and federal laws as we build a culture of life.

"As we bishops have stated many times, God created and loves every person, and we should respond to this love with reverence for the dignity of every human life, no matter how broken, unformed, disabled, or challenged that life may seem."






