God is in his holy place, God who unites those who dwell in his house; he himself gives might and strength to his people.

Of all the things that cause tension among siblings, sharing is probably near the top of the list. Whether it is the attention of one's parents, toys, or treats, there is an impulse towards selfishness, to grab and hold on.

I wonder if there wasn't some of that frustration in both of today's stories of multiplication of food. The unnamed man from 2 Kings and the unnamed boy from the Gospel of John were not only asked to give up



what they had, but to do so in service of an impossible goal: feeding hundreds and thousands of people.

In the psalm today we acclaimed that "the hand of the Lord feeds us, He answers all our needs". We may

understand that intellectually, but that isn't always reflected in our lives. How often do I turn away from moments of generosity, fearing that I will lose too much, that the effort won't bear fruit anyway, that I am better off focusing on my own needs and desires?

We are not able say 'yes' to every request that comes our way - but we are called to be ready to give joyfully when we can. Let us ask the Lord for the gift of trust, that we may not cling tightly to what we have but instead share it with those around us - especially those most in need of our generosity. July 25, 2021 July 26 is the **memorial** of Saints Joachim and Anne, parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Though their lives are only recorded in apocryphal writing and legends of the saints (particularly *The*

Golden Legend by Jacobus da Varagine - well worth adding to your library!), the Church in both the East and the West venerate them with liturgical feast days.

May we ask both of Mary's parents to intercede on our behalf, that we may likewise discern and follow God's plan for us.

In addition to our church being open for prayer every weekday (9 am to 4 pm), did you know that we have a holy hour at Saint Mark parish every Wednesday evening from 5:00 pm to 6:00 pm? The Blessed Sacrament is exposed in the church while confessions are heard. The holy hour concludes with Solemn Benediction and is immediately followed by Evening Prayer and Mass.

Whether you come in for just a few moments or an extended period of prayer, consider

taking time each week to visit the Lord, offer your prayers, and enjoy the presence and love of Christ.

Parishes and volunteers who join the endeavor will identify host families who can provide temporary care for at risk children in their home while other parishioners and volunteers provide wraparound support as family friends, resource friends, family coaches, prayer supporters or donors. 


