A great sign appeared in heaven: a woman clothed with the sun, and the moon beneath her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars *Cf. Rev 12: 1*

On August 15 the Church celebrates the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Although every Sunday celebration of Mass is a solemnity - thus trumping other celebrations - this solemnity takes precedence. And so we take a break from our reading of the Bread of Life discourse in the Gospel of John to instead meditate on Mary. In particular, we are invited to consider how God brought her bodily into heaven.



Though Mary was preserved from sin so as to prepare her for her singular role as the mother of God, it would be a mistake to think that her destiny - heaven! - is unique. We are all

called to heaven, to be brought bodily into the presence of God.

By the grace of God, Mary was born without Original Sin and committed no sins during her life, and so was spared the corruption of death. In short, she was ready to enter heaven immediately at the end of her life! By our participation in sin, we are not ready.....yet!

But we can be made ready, by the same grace of God. Our participation in the sacraments - most especially in the confession of our sins and the worthy reception of the Eucharist will likewise prepare us so to follow in the path Mary (and her Son before her!), has shown us. August 15, 2021 August 21 is the **memorial** of Pope Saint Pius X. He is most famous for promoting liturgical reform and initiating the creation of the 1917 Code of Canon Law.

Saint Pius X's coat of



arms, has the symbol of an anchor cast into a stormy sea. This is an allusion to Hebrews 6:19: "this [hope in God] we have as an anchor of the soul, sure and firm, which reaches into the interior behind the veil". Pope Saint Pius X dedicated his life to that hope, "*Instaurare omnia in Christo*" ("to restore all things to Christ") were his last words.

Please remember to **pray for our school**! After the celebration of the sacraments, the largest ministerial outreach of Saint Mark parish is our school. Since September 6, 1955, Saint Mark school has been educating students and faithfully offering the fullness of the Catholic faith. More recently, we have begun the transition to a classical Catholic curriculum.

Let us together pray for our principal, teachers, staff, students, and parents as they

prepare for the coming academic year - may God bless them with many graces!

Praying, Offering Intentions During Mass

"Become holy. Each one of us has a capacity to become holy and the way to holiness is prayer." ~St. Teresa of Calcutta

As Catholics, we often hear about *active participation* at the Holy Sacrifice of Mass. We may think that active participation means *physical participation* - such as being a cantor, a lector, an Extraordinary Minister or even standing and kneeling at all the right moments.

Active participation actually refers to our *interior* participation at Mass. If we do not pray with attention and devotion, we do not pray at all. Our interior participation at Mass is the most important.

Each Mass takes us to the foot of the Cross, where the sacrifice of Christ on our behalf is made present to us. In addition to praying the Mass with an engaged mind and heart, we also actively participate by joining (offering up) our own *sacrifices and intentions*.

This is a privilege we have as Catholics because we have been united to Christ through the sacrament of baptism. He is the head of the Church, and we are His Body. Just as the priest offers the Holy Sacrifice for a particular intention, we too can offer it for a personal intention; to apply the infinite, redeeming Blood of Jesus Christ to a particular person or cause.

The place in the Mass where this happens is the Offertory, which immediately follows the Prayers of the Faithful. The bread and wine are brought before the altar and Father begins the preparation and blessing of the gifts. When he uncovers the paten we can mentally place our intentions on the host.

He says: "Pray, brethren, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father."

The phrase *and yours* refers to our personal sacrifices and intentions that we unite with the one sacrifice of Christ. We reply: "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church."

Then the priest prays over the offerings after which the people say, *Amen*.

Jesus then presents our sacrifices and intentions to God the Father, who looks on us with favor because we have united ourselves to His Son.


