

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

- Father Jacob Maurer

Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long. O Lord, you are good and forgiving, full of mercy to all who call to you.

Cf. Ps 86 (85): 3, 5

"From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and they defile."

Jesus reminds us today of a truth that we know in our minds but often forget in our practice: corruption comes from within our own hearts. Even in the midst of a sick and broken world and we are certainly familiar with the sickness & brokenness of the world! - we are called to live out fidelity, hopefulness, and charity.



We all too easily fall into the trap of highlighting the failures of others, so I'll stick with my own (there are certainly plenty!).


I mentioned last week that I have

been struggling with discouragement at the divisions evident in society and in the Church. In fairness, I must also admit that I have at times fostered the resentments and bitterness that fuel those divisions. My temptation is to look at the flaws of others (or at least, what I deem to be their flaws!) and stand in judgment of them. 'I'm better than them, at least!' From there it is a short hop to justifying the vices that I would prefer not to surrender to Jesus.

And that is the key: surrendering even our vices to Jesus - who stands not in judgment but in love of us. Moreover, His love heals our wounds, enabling us to love as He does.

After a long time away (and with gratitude to an anonymous donor), the biretta is back!

A brief primer: yes, that is a pom on the top of





What we DO know is that the biretta, like the headwear of other clerical ranks, is particular to priests & deacons. It's use - especially the removal the names of Jesus, Mary, the Trinity, and the saint of the day - helps emphasizes the solemn nature of liturgical celebrations.

September 3 is the memorial of Saint Gregory the Great. Called 'the great' due to his extraordinary impact on the Church, Saint Gregory is best known for his contributions to the law of the Church (Canon law), formation & support of chant (Gregorian chant), and care for the poor.

Gregory was particularly mindful of the needs of those living in poverty, such that he required clerics to go into the street and help those in their region. May we likewise balance our care for the Lord, His Church, and His people!


