WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

- Father Jacob Maurer

You are just, O Lord, and your judgment is right; treat your servant in accord with your merciful love.

Cf. Ps 119 (118): 137, 124

Reflecting on the healing of the man suffering from deafness and a speech impediment, it is helpful to focus on this aspect of Jesus' miracles: why does He perform them?

Miraculous healing of physical infirmities are not themselves the point. Certainly, those who receive them are grateful, but they always point to our relationship with Jesus. The feeding of the five thousand prepares us for the Eucharist, the raising of Lazarus foreshadows resurrection from the dead, and so on.



In this miracle we are reminded that every one of us is spiritually deaf - and each of us has a speech impediment, at least when it comes to speaking with the love of God and proclaiming His Gospel. We often prefer to close our ears to His voice and speak with our own will, rather than according to His.

We need to be healed of the spiritual infirmities that keep us from hearing God's voice, that keep us from speaking His word plainly. May we present ourselves to Jesus for such healing! September 8 is the celebration of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Although there are no canonical sources



for the birth of Mary, tradition honors her birth on this day - nine months after the celebration of her immaculate conception (December 8).

Though little is known about her birth, we mark this day in honor of the Blessed Mother and take this opportunity to ask her for her intercession on our behalf.

Saint Mark Catholic Classical School begins this Tuesday! Our school staff and teachers have spent the last several weeks preparing for the launch of classes and now it is here. Students will kick off the beginning of school with spirit day dress, with all of our classes being offered in-person.

We are proud of our school, which is now

entering a third academic year of this pandemic and continuing to grow. Let us pray for our school
