

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Give peace, O Lord, to those who wait for you, that your prophets be found true. Hear the prayers of your servant, and of your people Israel.

Cf. Sir 36:18

"You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." Christ's admonition to Peter is not an insult but a warning. Satan's influence is not in supernatural acts but in convincing humanity to turn from God's will.

The thing is, Satan accomplishes this through lies and deception - or rather the same lies that first lie in the Garden of Eden: that we can't trust God to care for us. This is the deception that fooled Adam & Eve and Peter is falling for it here. He can't see how Jesus'



death & resurrection could possibly be a good thing.

We struggle with surrendering ourselves even today. If anything, the temptation to grasp for control is greater - after all, we have

greater knowledge & technology than ever.

It took most of his life, but Saint Peter eventually learned to trust Jesus - even to the point of his own death. Tradition holds that as Peter fled Rome, he encountered a vision of Christ carrying the cross. Jesus looked at him and simply asked "Quo vadis?" - "where are you going?".

Peter understood Jesus' exhortation to trust that even his own death would be for the greater glory of God. May we pray for that trust, offering our will and very lives to Him. The Nicene Creed,

recited at every solemnity (which includes Sunday Masses), reminds us of the four Marks of the Church: One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic - among other elements of our faith.



Despite how it begins ("I believe"), the creed is not a profession of individual faith. Rather than the voice of any particular believer, the "I" of the creed is the voice of the Church - all Her members together. We first profess our shared faith before being united in our communal celebration of the Eucharist and reception of Christ. In Him we are one body.

September 11, 2021 marks the twentieth anniversary of the deadly attacks on the World Trade Center towers and on the Pentagon.

For so many - even those of us on the other side of the country - the events of that day have shaped much of our lives. A new level of fear, suspicion, and division entered into American culture and, by extension, the culture of the entire world.

Though we still feel the effects of the acts

of a relative few, we know that Christ heals all wounds. We call on Him to do so for us and for the whole world.





This unique and beautiful mosaic was sponsored, built and is maintained by Council 11217. The idea for a memorial started over 15 years ago. The final project cost over \$100,000 and is truly a sight to behold as a testimonial to the support of life by Knights of Columbus and our many supporters.

The composition of mosaic tiles allows the entire picture to change with the light, affording the viewer an ongoing change during their meditation, prayer or viewing time.

Many of our supporters, parishioners, friends and family members have purchased memorial pavers in this tranquil garden to support the Knights' Pro-Life activities. You too now have the chance to have your family, group or council memorialized with a name or message on a paver in this garden. There are fewer than 300 spaces available.
