WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

O come, let us worship God and bow low before the God who made us, for he is the Lord our God.

Cf. Ps 95 (94): 6-7

Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men."

The account of call of the disciples is a bit of a puzzling story. This story comes some time after the events of last Sunday's gospel account, where He is rejected in His home town. Since then, Jesus has gained quite a reputation - not only from His bold announcement at the synogague but also from many miracles of healing He has performed on behalf of those in need. News of Him has spread everywhere in the surrounding region. Although He has rebuked demons, not allowing them to speak, some folks may have even taken notice of the title 'Son of God'.



In this context, it is not terribly surprising that Simon - soon to be named Peter - would react as he does when Jesus demonstrates His knowledge and holiness. "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." Perhaps not just humility, but shame, drives Peter to urge Christ to go elsewhere, to seek other companionship.

What a turnaround, then, for Peter, James, John, and their companions to leave everything and follow Jesus just a few moments later! What brings them around so fully, moving them from awe & fear to a willingness to so completely devote themselves to Christ?

I imagine that the Lord's demeanor was itself one of perfect

The Calling of Saint Peter and Saint kindness - His care for Peter's insecurity ('do not be afraid') - was a Andrew by James Tissot particularly strong draw. But there is something more going on here

too. Jesus offers a clarity of purpose, a mission to be joined, that is so compelling, so desireable, that these men were willing to leave behind their fishing gear, their boats, and even the amazing catch of fish they had just made. We can reasonably guess that it was probably a combination of their own religious upbringing, the news of this extraordinary prophet, and the realization that He wanted them to be part of His work. Who *wouldn't* jump at the chance to accompany - to assist! - the miracle-worker they had heard so much about and whose power they had just witnessed.

As we prepare for Lent and as we look to the future - perhaps with greater hope than we've had a while! - let us consider how has Christ extended His invitation to you and I, to us as a community. What is the clarity of purpose, the mission to be joined, of Saint Mark parish - and how might we join together as disciples of Christ to ourselves be fishers of men?

Fraudulent Emails & Texts Alert

We have once again received reports of both staff and parishioners receiving email or text messages claiming to be from Father Maurer requesting that the recipient reply to the message and send gift cards. In all cases someone had set up a fake address (either a phone number or the free email service Gmail). These fake accounts used Father Maurer's name.

These messages are scams designed to steal from you.

Father Maurer would never make such a request, nor would any parish staff

If you receive such an email or text do not reply to it!

- Block the sender.
- Do not provide personal or bank information.
- Before making a donation electronically of any kind, attempt to verify the legitimacy of the organization.
- Be cautious of emails claiming to contain pictures in attached files, as the files may contain viruses.
- Do not click on links contained within an unsolicited email or text.
- Do not provide personal or financial information to anyone who solicits contributions: providing such information may compromise your identity and make you vulnerable to identity theft.

If you think you may have inadvertently given your personal information to a scammer contact your bank and local authorities immediately. You can contact the Internet Crime Complaint Center through the FBI at <u>http://</u><u>www.ic3.gov</u> to report suspicious email solicitations. If the scammer used information that referred to St. Mark parish please contact Todd Chapman at (206) 364-7900 or <u>toddc@saintmarkshoreline.org</u>.

Please know that the Saint Mark parish database has not been compromised in any way. The email addresses and phone numbers used by the scammer were listed on our website, available to anyone online, or they were from archived issues of our bulletin, also available to anyone online.

To ensure everyone has a voice in this synodal process and an opportunity to journey with each other, Pope Francis has outlined **three phases of this global process**:

Diocesan, Your Local Church October 2021 to May 2022

You are invited to journey and share your voice in a local listening session.

Continental

September 2022 to March 2023

Bishops from each diocese will share their learnings and develop regional reports for the Vatican.

Universal

October 2023 and beyond

In October 2023, the Vatican's General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops will focus on discussing the input and ideas from the people.

Our Journey Together

Archbishop Etienne's local mission-focused efforts align well with Pope Francis's synodal process. Parishes are encouraged to move forward in pastoral planning by participating in the global synodal efforts from October 2021 through early May 2022. Insights from these listening sessions will be shared with the pope and will inform local pastoral planning efforts.




