Of you my heart has spoken, Seek his face. It is your face, O Lord, that I seek; hide not your face from me.

This Saturday we will be celebrating the solemnity of Saint Joseph, husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Jubilee Year of Saint Joseph concluded late last year, yet our prayers to the Jesus' earthly father continue on ("To you, O blessed Joseph"). We have in Saint Joseph a powerful intercessor and defender!

Recently I came across "Consecration to Saint Joseph", by Father Donald Calloway. One of the many things I discovered was the devotion



to sleeping Saint Joseph - a devotion for which the Holy Father himself shares a fondness!

Part of that devotional practice involves this little statue (above) which sits on the dresser across from my bed. Written prayers and petitions placed beneath it, entrusted to Saint Joseph, before going to sleep. Though I offer these to the Lord in my own prayers, this devotion reminds me that God works even when we are resting - and then often in wondrous and powerful ways.

Pope Saint John XXIII is known to have gone to sleep each night with the following prayer: "Well Lord, it's your Church, you take care of it; I'm going to sleep." Like Saint Joseph before him, he knew that God is in charge! May we similarly entrust our needs to Him. If I have anything to say about it, my epitaph will be include one of my favorite invitations: *Go to confession*.

Happily, I'm still around

to offer that call more personally, so I'd like to do so here. Especially if it has been a long time, **come to confession this Lent!** I am hearing confessions four evenings a week (see the schedule below), though individual appointments are welcome.

We have all sinned, falling short of the glory of God - but His mercy endures forever!

The season of Lent is an excellent time to come to the sacrament of Reconciliation. Especially if it has been a long time, please take this time to celebrate God's mercy.

We are called to attend Mass in person, to enter into God's sacred space to physically encounter the Lord in an extraordinary way, entering into the liturgy and worshiping God in community with others.

"Blessed are those who dwell in your house! They never cease to praise you." ~ Psalm 84

"For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I."  $\sim$  Matthew 18:20

"And let us consider how to arouse one another to charity and good works; not forsaking our assembly as is the custom of some, but exhorting one another, and this all the more as you see the Day drawing near." ~ Hebrews 10:24-25

"We too are gathered round the table of the Lord, the table of the Eucharistic sacrifice, in which he once again gives us his Body and makes present the one sacrifice of the Cross. It is in listening to his word, in nourishing ourselves with his Body and his Blood that he moves us on from being a multitude to being a community, from anonymity to communion. The Eucharist is the sacrament of communion that brings us out of individualism so that we may follow him together, living out our faith in him." ~ Pope Francis, May 30, 2013

"Just as the term 'Church' refers to the living temple, God's People, the term 'church' also has been used to describe "the building in which the Christian community gathers to hear the word of God, to pray together, to receive the sacraments, and celebrate the eucharist." ~ Built of Living Stones, guidelines of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops.

Whenever communities have built houses for worship, the design of the building has been of critical importance. Churches are never 'simply gathering spaces but signify and make visible the Church living in [a particular] place, the dwelling of God' among us, now 'reconciled and united in Christ.'

#### Catholic Archdiocese of Seattle Welcomes New Auxiliary Bishop Appointed by Pope Francis Father Frank Schuster Appointed Eighth Auxiliary Bishop of Archdiocese of Seattle

SEATTLE – March 8, 2022 – Archbishop Paul D. Etienne today welcomed the appointment of Father Frank Schuster, current pastor of St. Vincent de Paul Parish in Federal Way, as the new auxiliary bishop for the Archdiocese of Seattle.

"I am very grateful to the Holy Father for trusting me in this way," said Bishop-elect Schuster, who has served as a priest of the Archdiocese of Seattle for nearly 23 years. "I'm also especially grateful to Archbishop Etienne for his support of me. I am enthusiastic to do what he needs me to do as his auxiliary."

"It is truly a blessing to have Father Frank Schuster appointed to this auxiliary role," said Archbishop Etienne. "His love for Jesus and joy for the priesthood is expressed through his love of service and enthusiasm for the Gospel. As an auxiliary bishop, he will join Bishop Eusebio Elizondo, and together, as shepherds, they will extend the ministry of our Lord Jesus accompanying people in their faith life. He will join in this season's confirmations, attend deanery events, celebrate with the faithful, and be a partner for the Gospel out in the field. As such, I intend to keep him with his parish community so that he may continue to be one with the people."

"I'm delighted that his intention is for me to stay in parish ministry. The ability to stay rooted in a community of faith is going to be grounding for me and lifegiving," added Bishop-elect Schuster.

#### The Request for an Auxiliary Bishop

Former Auxiliary Bishop Daniel Mueggenborg, who served in the Archdiocese of Seattle for four years, was appointed to the Diocese of Reno on July 20, 2021. After he moved, Archbishop Etienne requested a new auxiliary to help serve the Archdiocese of Seattle, which covers all of Western Washington, spanning from Canada down to the Oregon border and serving more than 600,000 Catholics.

"My vision is to restructure how we're operating in the Archdiocese of Seattle," said Archbishop Etienne, who has been eager to get out with the people. "Moving forward, the bishops will spend more time on their pastoral duties and less time on their administrative duties, which will be handled by the new leadership at the chancery."

#### **Father Frank Schuster**

Father Frank Schuster was born in Mount Vernon, Washington, to John and Virginia Schuster. At age 6 he, along with his parents and two siblings, Carolyn and John, moved to Maple Valley, where they lived along the Cedar River. He enjoyed his family-focused, Catholic upbringing and admits to being a bit of a rascal as a child and while attending Kennedy Catholic High School, where his father was the principal for more than 20 years. At the University of Washington, Father Schuster earned his B.A. in psychology, but spent most of his time at the Newman Center in peer ministry. After college he moved to Illinois and attended Mundelein Seminary where he received his Bachelor of Sacred Theology and his Master of Divinity.

"After my third year of theology, I knew from the bottom of my heart that I had no other future. I knew it. I felt it," said Father Schuster, who was ordained a priest on June 12, 1999. "I love being a priest. I'm just happy to be of service."

He added, "It's about going to the hospital when someone calls you. It's about being there for people when they're down. Having time to be able to sit down with someone who's homeless. ... Our lives should always point to Jesus."

Bishop-elect Schuster's love for Jesus and service has been felt at his pastoral assignments in the Archdiocese of Seattle:

- 2003–2007: Pastor, Church of the Assumption, Bellingham
- 2004–2007: Dean, Presbyteral Council member
- 2006–2007: Pastor, Sacred Heart Church, Bellingham
- 2006–2007: Chaplain, Catholic Campus Ministry, Western Washington University, Bellingham
- 2007–2021: Pastor, St. Teresa of Calcutta Church, Woodinville
- 2016–present: Director, Permanent Deacon Formation
- 2021–present: Pastor, St. Vincent de Paul Church, Federal Way


