WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, the King of Israel.
Hosanna in the highest.

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday, and so enter into Holy Week. This one Mass aptly summarizes the Sacred Triduum: we welcome Christ with joy..... and then we crucify Him. We killed God. Not just the Romans, not just the Scribes and Pharisees - but us. We killed Him.

This week is given to us as an opportunity to reflect on our part in Christ's Passion, especially in the celebrations of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. May we use this time to express our sorrow for sin - our own and those of the whole world.

Cf. Mt 21: 9

The *Tre Ore* (meaning 'three hours') service of Good Friday - also called 'The Three Hours' Agony - commemorates the Passion of Christ. Over these three hours, we recount the last seven words of Christ, with brief homilies offered as we quietly reflect on the suffering and sacrifice of the Lord on our behalf.

Saint Mark's *Tre Ore* service will be on Friday, April 15, from 12 pm to 3 pm.



There is a tradition of celebrating the *Tenebrae* (meaning 'darkness') service, known as the 'Service of Shadows'. It was traditionally a combination of *matins* and *lauds* - the first hours of the Divine Office, marking the end of Lent and the beginning of the Triduum.

In this service, there are three 'nocturns' - each composed of psalms, lessons, and responsories. Fifteen candles are lit at the start of the service, with one extinguished after each psalm. The final candle - representing Christ - remains lit but is removed. The *strepitus* (a loud noise) rings out, signifying the closing of His tomb.

Saint Mark's *Tenebrae* service will be on Wednesday, April 13 after the 6:30 pm Mass.

Today is Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, just days before he was crucified.

Palm Sunday is known as such because the faithful will receive palm fronds which they use to participate in the reenactment of Christ's arrival in Jerusalem. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect.

Palm branches are widely recognized symbol of peace and victory, hence their use on Palm Sunday.

The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic; it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war.

A week later, Christ would rise from the dead on the first Easter.

During Palm Sunday Mass, palms are distributed to parishioners who carry them in a ritual procession into church.

The palms are blessed and many people will fashion them into small crosses or other items of personal devotion.

Benedict lived in Italy during a time of great chaos. The Roman Empire had disintegrated. Rome fell to barbarians in the year 410 and was sacked again in 455. Romulus Augustulus, the last emperor, was deposed in 476. Theodoric of the Ostrogoths maintained peace during a long reign (493-526) but upon his death the Eastern Emperor Justinian tried to regain Rome, and for the rest of the 6th century there was constant war as other barbarian tribes invaded the Italian peninsula.

Through those years of strife, the Rule of St. Benedict helped create communities where monks lived harmoniously among one another. The monasteries became places where monks could live in fellowship with others and grow in their own faith. Because of its benefits, the Rule of St. Benedict became a foundation for monastic life through the centuries. And now during modern times, it can also provide a foundation for a peaceful, faith-filled home life.

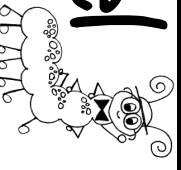
Did you get a palm branch at the beginning of Mass today? Hold your palm quietly during Mass, then take it home and keep it in a special place at your house.

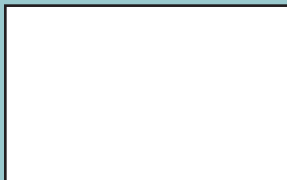
