

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

I have risen, and I am with you still, alleluia. You have laid your hand upon me, alleluia. Too wonderful for me, this knowledge, alleluia, alleluia. Cf. Ps 139 (138): 18, 5-6

Happy Easter! May the joy & glory of Christ's resurrection from the dead, His triumph over sin & death, and His victory over the grave be with you all.

Today marks the end of the Sacred Triduum, the culmination of our long Lenten journey with Christ to and through His Passion and death. Now begins forty days - no longer of fasting and abstinence, but celebration and rejoicing in the return of our Lord & Saviour.

Liturgically, our celebrations reflect our joy in the return of the gloria, the alleluia, the sign of peace, flowers, instrumental music, and hymns. Though Easter holds the rank of 'solemnity', its a *joyful* solemnity!

May we continue that celebration throughout the coming days - offering a little more in the way of prayers together at home, generosity to those in need, feasting with family & friends. In all that we do, may our lives reflect this truth: He is risen - He is risen indeed!

On Easter Sunday, there is called the Victimae paschali laudes ("Christians, to the Paschal Victim"). Taking place between the second reading and the Gospel, a sequence is a special addition to the joyful



'alleluia', emphasizing the solemnity of the Church's great celebrations.

Though sequences are only mandated on Easter and Pentecost, there are optional sequences for Corpus Christi and Our Lady of Sorrows. Check out the USCCB website for the English translation of today's sequence.

Easter Sunday marks the beginning of the Easter season and the octave (eight days) of **Easter.** Unlike other octaves - such as those of Christmas, Epiphany, or Pentecost - each day in the octave of Easter holds the rank of solemnity. It is as if we celebrate Easter anew every day of the octave (because we do!).

Practically speaking, we are meant to elevate each day throughout the octave. Perhaps we pray the liturgy of the hours together, go to Mass, have a mini-feast (or dessert!) each day - but in each day, celebrate Christ's resurrection!

The Knights of Columbus will be serving up their amazing pancake breakfast once again on May 15 in the cafeteria after both Masses!


It's so very, very much more than pancakes. If you've been then you know; if you haven't this is the chance for you and your family to experience the best breakfast around!

What is the Octave Easter?

Easter Sunday is not the end of our Easter celebration. After forty days of preparation and the Easter Triduum, it is easy to not look ahead on the liturgical calendar. This is the climax of the year with the celebration of the Passion, death and Resurrection. The Catechism calls Easter the "Feast of feasts" and the "Solemnity of solemnities." Easter Sunday is the first day of the Easter Octave, the eight-day joyful period, in which we continue to celebrate the conclusion to the Paschal mystery.

The eight days of the Easter Octave are a special time to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection and more deeply contemplate its mysteries. The Church punctuates the special importance of this feast by assigning it the highest liturgical ranking as a Privileged Octave of the First Order. This means each of the eight days is counted as a solemnity, the highest-ranking feast day, in which no other feast can be celebrated. It begins the fifty days of the Easter celebration to the feast of Pentecost but these first eight days of the Easter Octave culminates with the second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday.

Divine Mercy Sunday

The modern Divine Mercy devotions began with the Polish mystic, St. Faustina Kowalska, who recorded in her diary everything that Christ commissioned to her regarding His Divine Mercy. These devotions included the spiritual practices of the image of Divine Mercy, with its simple prayer "Jesus, I trust in You!," praying the Chaplet and Novena of Divine Mercy and establishing Divine Mercy Sunday.

St. Pope John Paul II said he felt spiritually "very near" Saint Faustina and he had "been thinking about her fora long time," when he began his second encyclical Divesin Misericordia, "Rich in Mercy," in which he calls mercy "love's second name." No wonder then that he at the canonization ceremony of St. Faustina designated the Easter Octave Divine Mercy Sunday. ~catholicexchange.com

All students, kindergarten through third grade, have a special reading buddy who spends time with them every Tuesday morning sharing the magical world of books!














