Dear friends,

Today we enter into the second week of our in-parish mission. If last Sunday's homily was a jolt to your system, know that you are not alone! In phone calls to the office, e-mails among the parish leadership, and conversations between staff, everyone agrees: this is a lot!

As promised last week, our staff and parish leadership have put together a brief summary sheet, included in today's bulletin. Composing it was not without its own challenges - there was no small debate about how to present our circumstances, what details to highlight, or if we should even put this all out at this time. I am grateful to our pastoral council, our finance council, and to our staff - particularly Todd Chapman, our PAA - for their input. At the end of it all, I am convinced that getting this summary to you now rather than later is key. Before we can move forward, we need to know where we are, facing our challenges as directly and transparently as we can.

Between my homily last week (which I've made available at my blog - fathermaurer.com), and the summary this week, its clear that we have challenges! As we begin to more fully understand those challenges, it is natural - and healthy - to feel overwhelmed, fearful, or angry. When we do feel those things, it will be important **not** to avoid them! These are signs of our limitations and weakness, yes, but they are also opportunities for prayer. Naming our fears, expressing our anger, and offering our sense of smallness in the face of overwhelming circumstances empowers us to reach out to each other and to the Lord for what we need. After all this is **Christ's** parish! He is the One who will answer our needs..... once we recognize that we are in need and ask His help.

I want you to know that I, too, have and sometimes still feel overwhelmed, scared, and even angry. I am grateful for my priest support group, who gave me some wonderful advice when we met last Monday - you can read about it in the blog post linked above. May we take time to reflect on our need for Christ - and the part to which He is calling each of us. What we face, we face together and with Him, knowing that He will inspire and empower us to overcome all things.


Parish Financial Update St. Mark Catholic Church, Shoreline WA

May 2022

Current State

The parish staff, Finance Council, and Pastoral Council have reviewed our financial situation as we prepare the budget for the new fiscal year beginning on July 1. It's been a tumultuous time for our parish over the last few years, and that's had an impact on our finances. We saw an ex-

pected decrease in donation income when we were prohibited from meeting in person for Mass - and in fact, the decrease during that time was not as bad as it could have been, so THANK YOU to all of you who continued to donate online during this time. However, our donation income has not recovered from that drop. Our ordinary income for this fiscal year is forecast to be \$155K (18%) lower than in 2019. The impact of



this reduced income has been somewhat mitigated by the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), which provided loans to organizations to enable them to retain employees through the pandemic. Our parish meets the conditions to have these loans forgiven, resulting in additional "income" for the parish: \$167k for the parish, and an additional \$257k for the school. These funds have substantially offset the reduced income in 2020-2022, but the program has ended and we will not be receiving any additional PPP funds. We also received two generous \$100K bequests in our 2020-2022 fiscal years, further offsetting the decrease in ordinary income - but like the PPP funds, we cannot count on such bequests being available in the future.

Next Year

If the current trend of decreasing donations continues, we are forecasting a deficit of about \$170k in our next fiscal year, primarily resulting from the decreased income. We cannot prudently operate with a deficit of this extent; we would run out of cash in roughly two years. In order to balance our budget, we will need to consider several changes to our plans for the coming year, such as:

- Reducing the amount of the parish subsidy to our school, and pulling additional funds from the school endowment to make up the gap.
- Reducing budgets across most areas of parish operations, including our liturgy, faith formation, and office expenses. Among other impacts, this would result in less funding available for candles, incense, and instrumentalists; increased delays when contacting the parish office; and fewer resources and supplies for our faith formation programs.

Looking Forward to Our Future

We can reverse the current trend and restore our parish to a healthy financial condition. Increasing our income will require a combination of both increasing our membership of active parishioners, and a generous spirit of sacrificial giving. Beyond the direct financial contributions (which are indeed critical!), your contributions of time and talent build up our parish into a more welcoming and engaged community, which draws in new members. This requires active support from ALL parishioners – not just by the pastor, staff, and dedicated group of existing volunteers. Your contributions matter! Please, prayerfully consider where you can contribute more to our parish, and thus do your part to ensure that our reverent liturgy can be celebrated in our beautiful church for many years to come. Your support and engagement is necessary, and it enables our critical mission of spreading the gospel and drawing souls to Christ our Lord!

- [†] A walk can help. If your little one is having a hard time feel free to pop out to the vestibule, the bathrooms or outside for a break.
- † Rewards (who said bribes?) can help. Donuts are back and children are welcome! There is often a Kids' Page in the bulletin - feel free to grab one on your way into the church.
- † Nobody expects perfect behavior. The most important thing is that you and your family are here.

Is God Calling You to Marriage? How do you know if you're ready to take the next step in your relationship?

Our faith teaches that marriage is a vocation. As with every call, we have the freedom to respond or not. You might be at a point in your relationship when you are considering marriage. The decision to marry is an important one and is best approached with reflection, prayer and open conversation.

The Archdiocese of Seattle's office of Marriage and Family Life offers some suggestions on discerning if you are ready for marriage.

Do you share in each other's faith? A shared spiritual life can help strengthen a couple's relationship, even in relationships where two people don't share the same religion. If your relationship with Jesus is an important part of your life, it would be ideal for your spouse to share in your faith and to support your spiritual growth. If you don't already share your spiritual life, invite your prospective spouse to get to know your faith. It will help them get to know you better and deepen your relationship. Don't be afraid to invite them to join you at church.

Is it enough to be in love with each other?

St. Mark Catholic Classical School Lion's Fund Updates


