The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole world and that which contains all things understands what is said, alleluia.

This weekend we celebrate the end of the Easter season and the birth of the Church: the coming of the Holy Spirit on **Pentecost**.

Though the visible sign of the Holy Spirit were the tongues of flames descending upon them, the more visible and lasting signs are found in the Apostles themselves: from that day forward they went forth to all ends of the earth proclaiming the Gospel.

The greatest gift received in baptism & confirmation: the indwelling of the Holy Spirit!

May we pray for the same missionary zeal that was given to the Twelve, that we may likewise go forth to model and share the Good News.

"Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth." June 6 is the memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church. How fitting that our reentry into Ordinary Time begins with a reminder that Mary is a patron of us all.



We spent the final week of our in-parish mission opening our hearts to the gifts of the Holy Spirit. May we likewise turn to the Blessed Virgin as both our model and our intercessor, trusting that She will care for and intercede for us to Her Son.



Catholic Social Teaching

Catholic social teaching is a central and essential element of our faith. Its roots are in the Hebrew prophets who announced God's special love for the poor and called God's people to a covenant of love and justice. It is a teaching founded on the life and words of Jesus Christ, who came "to bring glad tidings to the poor...liberty to captives...recovery of sight to the blind" (Lk 4:18-19), and who identified himself with "the least of these," the hungry and the stranger (cf. Mt 25:45). Catholic social teaching is built on a commitment to the poor which arises from our experiences of Christ in the eucharist. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains, "To receive in truth the Body and Blood of Christ given up for us, we must recognize Christ in the poorest, his brethren" (no. 1397).

Catholic social teaching emerges from the truth of what God has revealed to us about himself. We believe in the triune God whose very nature is communal and social. God the Father sends his only Son, Jesus Christ, and shares the Holy Spirit as his gift of love. God reveals himself to us as one who is not alone but rather as one who is relational, one who is Trinity. Therefore, we who are made in God's image share this communal, social nature. We are called to reach out and to build relationships of love and justice.



Next Step Pregnancy Services



Next Step Pregnancy Services is dedicated to serving with compassion and dignity the immediate and long-term needs of those facing unplanned pregnancies. We promote the sanctity of human life in a non-judgmental atmosphere filled with love and compassion. It is our goal to empower those we serve to make healthy lifestyle choices now and in the future.



Confidentiality is one of our guiding values (the "client" is a clinic volunteer).

Our nurses offer free pregnancy tests and ultrasound exams



Next Step Pregnancy Services opened in I998 in Shoreline as a pregnancy support center offering counseling on alternatives to abortion and providing an array of material goods to new mothers. In 2010 we moved to Lynnwood and became a medical pregnancy clinic adding early ultrasound exams to our other services. We serve women and families throughout the greater Seattle area.

In 2022 so far...

135 women came to our clinic for a free **pregnancy test**, 50 women came to us for a free **ultrasound exam**, we had 1,200 visits to our offices for **material goods**, including maternity clothes, diapers and wipes, blankets, baby clothes through age two, formula, and when we have them, toys, strollers, highchairs and other baby furniture. We gave away an average of 5000 **diapers** per month.
