Blest be God the Father, and the Only Begotten Son of God, and also the Holy Spirit, for he has shown us his merciful love.

This weekend we celebrate the **solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity**. Our understanding of the mystery of the Trinity is rooted in God's revelation of Himself in both the Old Testament and particularly from Jesus. We know that Jesus and the Father are one, and that the Holy Spirit is one with them both.

Throughout the history of the Church, there have been many efforts to simply and easily articulate the Trinity. If you've ever struggled to explain this aspect of our fatih, know that



you're in good company! There is a clever YouTube video titled '<u>St Patrick's</u> <u>Bad Trinity Analogies</u>' -Saint Patrick's exasperated confession of faith at the end doesn't exactly roll off of the tongue!

An aspect of our faith that may help us is the celebration of the

Eucharist - most particularly, the *purpose* of the Mass: communion with the Lord & each other.

What would it mean to be in perfect communion with each other, in perfect communion with God? Although we have not (yet!) experienced that perfect communion, we can look to the communion of the three Persons of the Trinity as our model - without losing their individuality, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are perfectly one. May we ask the Lord to likewise unite us together with Him! Antiphon from the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

June 13th is the memorial of **Saint Anthony of Padua**. Although a relatively minor celebration in the life of the Church, I admit to a bias: he is one of my favorite saints. Patron saint of preachers, Saint Anthony was known as the 'Hammer of Heretics' as well as the 'Golden Tongue'.



His fidelity and talent in preaching eventually caught the attention of his order's superior (Saint Francis) and eventually the pope himself (Pope Gregory). Saint Anthony of Padua, pray for us!

What is Juneteenth (June+nineteenth)? "As noted by the National Museum of African American History & Culture, Juneteenth is a time to celebrate, to gather as a family, to reflect on the past and look to the future. Within the African American community, Juneteenth is known as our second 'Independence Day'. It is a holiday that commemorates the June 19, 1865 announcement of the abolition of slavery

in Texas, and more generally the emancipation of African American slaves throughout the Confederate South."








## Next Step Pregnancy Services



Next Step Pregnancy Services is dedicated to serving with compassion and dignity the immediate and long-term needs of those facing unplanned pregnancies. We promote the sanctity of human life in a non-judgmental atmosphere filled with love and compassion. It is our goal to empower those we serve to make healthy lifestyle choices now and in the future.



Confidentiality is one of our guiding values (the "client" is a clinic volunteer).

Our nurses offer free pregnancy tests and ultrasound exams



Next Step Pregnancy Services opened in I998 in Shoreline as a pregnancy support center offering counseling on alternatives to abortion and providing an array of material goods to new mothers. In 2010 we moved to Lynnwood and became a medical pregnancy clinic adding early ultrasound exams to our other services. We serve women and families throughout the greater Seattle area.

### In 2022 so far...

135 women came to our clinic for a free **pregnancy test**, 50 women came to us for a free **ultrasound exam**, we had 1,200 visits to our offices for **material goods**, including maternity clothes, diapers and wipes, blankets, baby clothes through age two, formula, and when we have them, toys, strollers, highchairs and other baby furniture. We gave away an average of 5000 **diapers** per month.
