

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?





Cf. Ps 86 (85): 1-3

Turn your ear, O Lord, and answer me; save the servant who trusts in you, my God. Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long.

"Lord, will only a few people be saved?"

Scholars have long speculated as to the motivation of the anonymous person who asked Jesus this question. Though we won't get a definitive answer this side of heaven, there is strong reason to believe that this question was more pointed than it first appears - that the question was asked as a way of trying to prompt Jesus to exclude those who were considered to be undesireable or 'other'.



We are often rightly reminded that the Church is not a museum for saints but rather a field hospital for sinners. Jesus

hints at this later in today's Gospel - pointing out that many will attempt to enter through the narrow gate but will not be strong enough.

Though there is certainly a warning here about wandering from the Lord, might it also be an encouragement to the weak - a prompting for each of us to consider that *none of us* is strong enough? Jesus, good as He is, highlights our weakness not to shame us but to invite us to partake of His strength. It is precisely when we rely on ourselves, when we conclude that we do not need help as others do, that we are unable to enter the narrow gate!

But if we humble ask Jesus for help, He will supply the strength we lack to bring us to Him.

As many parents will testify, caring for one's child(ren) doesn't end when they move out.

Saint Monica, whose feast day we celebrate this Saturday (August 27), is an extraordinary model of perseverance and

intercession on behalf of her son.

Though he did not turn to the Lord until he was well into his adulthood, her son Saint Augustine did so with such conviction that he went on to become a Doctor of the Church - but always crediting his mother's prayers for his conversion. Saint Monica, pray for us!

One hallmark of Catholic liturgies is **Gregorian** chant. As recently as Vatican II, the Church proclaimed that Gregorian chant "should be given pride of place in liturgical services."

For this reason, we chant many of the prayers

at Mass - particularly the entrance, offertory, and communion antiphons.

May we all take the time to participate in all the prayers of the Mass - those spoken and those sung!
