



WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long. O Lord, you are good and forgiving, full of mercy to all who call to you.

As we reflect on today's gospel, I'd like to (re) introduce one of my favorite prayers - it is a helpful reflection in identifying where we might most need to invite the Lord's grace!

The Litany of Humility

O Jesus! meek and humble of heart, *Hear me*. From the desire of being esteemed,

Deliver me, Jesus.

From the desire of being loved...

From the desire of being extolled ...

From the desire of being honored ...

From the desire of being praised ...

From the desire of being preferred to others...

From the desire of being consulted ...

From the desire of being approved ...

From the fear of being humiliated ...

From the fear of being despised...

From the fear of suffering rebukes ...

From the fear of being calumniated ...

From the fear of being forgotten ...

From the fear of being ridiculed ...

From the fear of being wronged ...

From the fear of being suspected ...

That others may be loved more than I,

Jesus, grant me the grace to desire it.

That others may be esteemed more than I ...
That, in the opinion of the world,
others may increase and I may decrease ...
That others may be chosen and I set aside ...
That others may be praised and I unnoticed ...
That others may be preferred to me in
everything...

That others may become holier than I, provided that I may become as holy as I should...

August 29 is the memorial of the beheading of Saint John the Baptist. It might seem strange to celebrate such a



terrible moment, but the life and role John the Baptist was to proclaim the truth and prepare the way for Jesus.

It is no wonder that he lost his life for his fidelity and boldness - but it is a wonder that he persevered! We celebrate Saint John's witness to Lord, and ask that by his intercession we might be equally prophetic in our discipleship and ministry in our vocations.
