

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

You are just, O Lord, and your judgment is right; treat your servant in accord with your merciful love.

As we prayed the collect at Mass today, we might wonder what 'true freedom' looks like. Perhaps the crowds that travelled with Jesus in today's gospel had a similar question - and He offered an answer. It isn't enough to just follow along, we must be His disciples.

Even in social media, we find echoes of this. On nearly every platform, it is possible to 'follow' someone - without ever revealing one's self, much less engaging in real relationship. We keep our distance, without commitment or



exposure - nor more than the slightest of connection.

This might have an air of freedom - especially in keeping one's

options open. But for what? And that's the key: understanding what freedom is *for*. If it is simply for pursuing our own wants, we will end up being enslaved by whatever inflames our desires at a given moment.

True freedom is found in choosing the greatest good we can. Jesus modeled that choice in the cross. Countless saints have followed His example. We often marvel at how they seem unburdened, able to set aside power & possessions, enduring great suffering and sometimes even death - because they embraced discipleship in Christ. Letting go of all that holds us back, we too can live in freedom. How might we make that choice today - in what is Jesus calling us to enjoy true freedom?
